Keith has been involved in golf both as a player and a builder and is being inducted into the Saskatchewan Golf Hall of Fame in both categories.

Keith was born in Regina and played several sports. As a young golfer, he was runner-up in the 1955 Saskatchewan Junior Championship. Keith was Saskatchewan Amateur Champion in 1959 and 1962. He was a member of the 1964 Saskatchewan Amateur Team which won the Willingdon Cup, the only time the cup has been won by Saskatchewan. In all, he was on nine provincial Willingdon Cup teams between 1959 and 1969. He was Regina City Amateur Champion nine times.

Keith was a director of the Wascana Country Club in Regina for fifteen years including being

president in 1980. Provincially, he became a director of the Saskatchewan Golf Association in 1962 with a presidential term in 1972 and 1973. He became a governor of the Royal Canadian Golf Association in 1976, moving onto the executive in 1986, and serving as president in 1989. Internationally, he has represented the RCGA in the U.S., Great Britain and Japan.

Keith Rever was inducted into the Saskatchewan Sports Hall of Fame in 1991 and the Regina Sports Hall of Fame in 2004.
