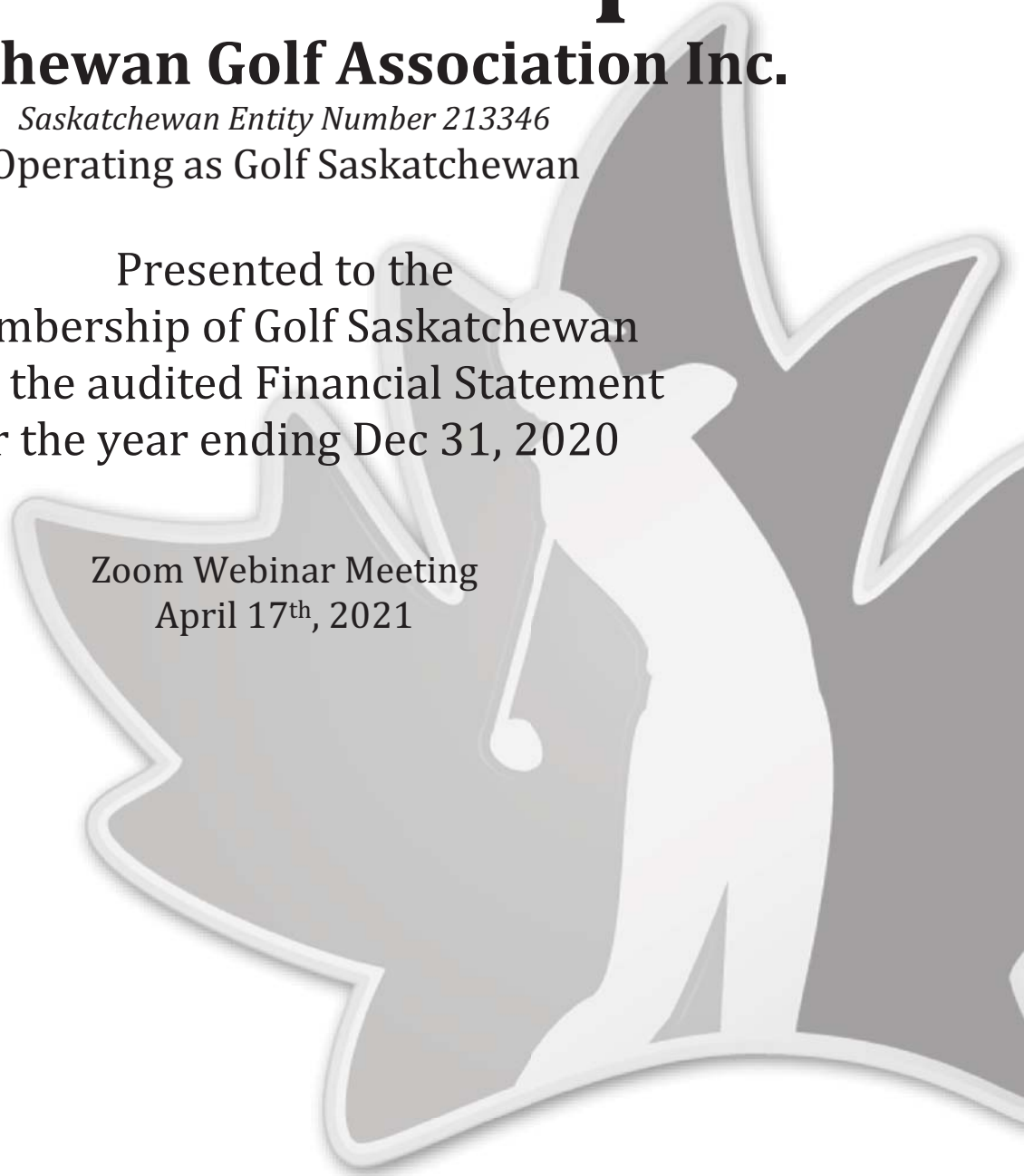

While there were no national championships in 2020, the group of people who could have made up a team would have represented the province proudly.
- 🌿 **Inclusive Golf Activities:** prior to the pandemic, we were moving towards a more inclusive series of golf activities. In 2021, we look forward to building the relationships with the Special Olympics chapter golf events, Para-Golf activities, blind golf, under-represented groups including the LGBTQ2SA+ golf enthusiasts.
- 🌿 **Celebrating Volunteers:** thank you to the numerous volunteers who assisted with the association's activities during COVID-19 events at championships, course ratings, and numerous virtual board meetings.
- 🌿 **Membership:** During a pandemic, our membership number in Saskatchewan remained strong.
- 🌿 **Rounds Played & Posted:** In a COVID-19 environment with 12-10-minute tee times, Saskatchewan people played a lot of golf. More than 210,000 rounds were posted for handicap purposes by members in Saskatchewan. An average of approximately 20 rounds per member.
- 🌿 **Coaching & Instruction:** we continue to invest in the development of our coaching initiatives with Steve Ryde and other PGA of Saskatchewan coaches across the province. Whether it is a young player or a veteran player wanting to improve, we assist in fostering a relationship with all experts, to make the game more enjoyable for everyone.

Golf Saskatchewan continues to focus on the four main areas of our Strategic Plan and the foundational measurements; 1. Ensuring Excellence, 2. Growing Participation, 3. Fostering Interaction and 4. Expanding Capacity. Looking forward using our Strategic Plan, I see continuing the collaborative partnerships with Golf Canada, other provincial golf associations and industry stakeholders to propel the game of golf forward. The goal of all golf associations is to increase participation, increasing member values and attracting new golfers to the sport. 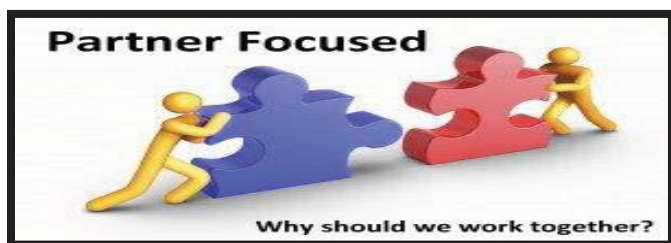

## Membership Assistance Program (MAP Grants)

The purpose of the Membership Assistance Program (MAP) grant is to provide financial assistance to Golf Saskatchewan registered affiliated clubs so they may operate programs encouraging and promoting community and club level sport development in their local area. Development of these programs and services will increase membership in Golf Saskatchewan and the local member organizations. MAP is funded by the Saskatchewan Lotteries Trust Fund for Sport, Culture & Recreation and is derived from the sale of lottery tickets in Saskatchewan.

In 2020, Golf Saskatchewan distributed \$100,000 in MAP Grants to 57 member clubs. A complete break-down of the clubs and the MAP funding from 20 can be found in the Audited Financial Statements (Schedule 7) of the audited financial statements.

In 2021, \$100,100 will be distributed to Member Clubs. Since we began tracking the distributed MAP GRANTS funds in 2001, approximately \$1.63 million has been allotted to member clubs. Thank you for the continued support in growing member participation in golf and remember to purchase your lottery tickets.

**Golf Fore the Cure**, is aimed to grow women's participation in the game of golf by introducing them to the game through fun, non-intimidating activities. Through a unique partnership structure with the Canadian Cancer Society the program has women across the country participate in golf activities raising money in the fight against breast cancer. Even if you are not a golfer there is no better chance for you to learn the game and have fun doing it.

In 2019, for a third year in a row, a group from Elk Ridge Resort was invited to the national GFTC event. Their one-day tournament raised over \$20,000, the second highest in Canada. Over the years of the event at Elk Ridge, the attendees and

committee have raised over \$100,000. All the funds raised stay in Saskatchewan and aid local patients.

In 2020, most Golf Fore The Cure events were put on hold. Nationally over \$116,522 was raised in 2020 through local GFTC events in other jurisdictions. The hard work and dedication of our participating events does not go unnoticed, and it is because of all our volunteers and participants through the years that Golf Fore the Cure has been able to raise more than \$7 million for vital breast cancer research and support programs.

## Golf Canada - Incident Protection Program

In 2020, 17 Golf Saskatchewan members submit claims under the Incident Protection Program (IPP) valued at \$7504.01 in damages, theft or loss. This was slightly behind the 20 incidents in 2019 resulting in \$11,262 claims being reimbursed. The items included a combination of equipment damage, loss or theft, broken glass, golf cart damage or the program paying the deductible on a member's home insurance for items above the valued threshold.

In 2021, we will continue to update our membership about the incident protection program.

## FINANCE COMMITTEE

I am pleased to present the financial report for 2020 for the year ending Dec 31<sup>st</sup>, 2020. The firm of VIRTUS GROUP has completed the annual audit of the financial statements of Golf Saskatchewan. In VIRTUS Group's opinion, management maintains an appropriate system of internal accounting controls ensure the transactions are accurately recorded on a timely basis, are properly approved and result in reliable financial statements. Management and the Board of Directors acknowledge the financial statements are their responsibility.

The Finance Committee, composed of members of the Board of Directors, meets with the management of Golf Saskatchewan to ensure accuracy of the association's financial reports. The Board of Directors has voted to approve the financial statements as presented in the Appendix I of the annual report. Financial highlights:

- i. **Revenues** of \$901,309 was an overall decreased of 2.79% or \$25,906 compared to the previous year.
  - o The decreases in revenues are in membership, grants, fundraising and championship areas.
- ii. **Expenses** of \$737,642 was a decreased 20.65% or \$191,974 comparable to the previous year.
  - o The decreases in overall expenses were related to the global pandemic and the impact of COVID-19.

The Expenses are detailed below and are also in the schedules of the audited financial statements.

- iii. **Administration (Schedule 3)** decreased approximately 7% or \$27,500.
- iv. **Capacity and Interaction (Schedule 4)** decreased approximately 82% or \$32,600.
- v. **Participation and Interaction (Schedule 5)** decreased approximately 55% or \$60,750.
- vi. **Excellence (Schedule 6)** decreased approximately 80% or \$64,000.
  - o No national championships in 2020 as all national championships were cancelled.
  - o We also had a couple of multi-sport game events in 2020 cancelled.
- vii. **MAP GRANT (Schedule 7)** are flow through expenses from the LTF grant for membership programming.

The overall result is a **\$163,667 surplus\*** of revenues over expenses and therefore an increase in the reserves (unrestricted net assets). \*NOTE: the surplus shown above is a timing of receiving the COVID-19 Emergency funds in December for \$79,240. The majority of the funds were dispersed to member clubs in Q1 of 2021.

### NOTES TO BUDGETING:

1. For the budgeting process, the board and management do not include any grant revenues unless they have officially been announced and received by the office.
2. For the 2020 Fiscal Year prior to the global pandemic, the Board of Directors approved a strategic deficit budget of **\$11,350** (with forecasted expenses totaling \$960,450 compared to revenues of \$949,100).
  - a. Actual Expenses = \$737,642 compared to Actual Revenues = \$901,309.
3. Reminder to membership: an approved deficit budget does not impact Golf Saskatchewan's overall financial position due to our strong reserve funds, and limited interest was accounted in our general operating funds. One of our strategic measures is a zero budget in less than three years.
  - a. For 2021, this was achieved with a surplus budget being approved.
4. For 2021, a notice to membership, Golf Saskatchewan received two phases of the Heritage Canada Emergency Funding for COVID-19.

Thank you to the Golf Saskatchewan staff, Board of Directors and the Finance Committee for their contributions during the past year.

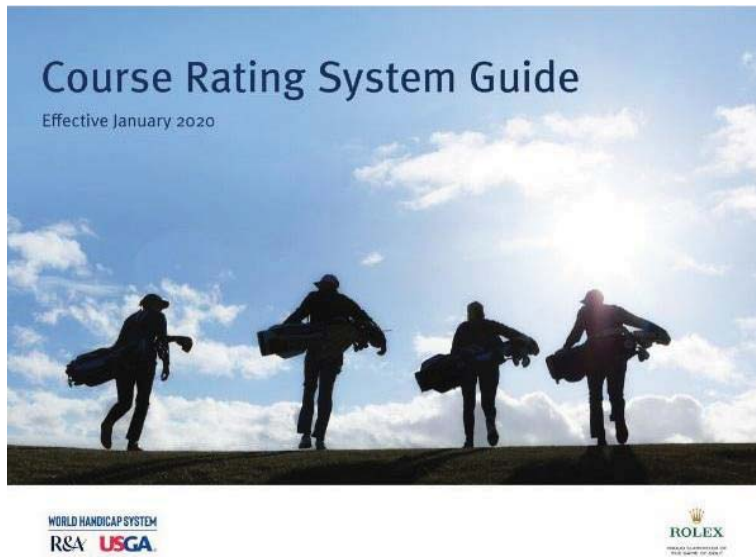

# COURSE RATING COMMITTEE



## Course Rating Workshops

Due to the COVID-19 restrictions, the 2020 course rating annual workshop scheduled for May 12 & 13 could not be held. The annual workshop was replaced by a shorter online workshop for current course raters focusing on the changes to the Course Rating System for 2020. The online workshop was attended by 19 volunteers and 4 staff.

## Member Club Course Ratings in 2020

COVID-19 restrictions and concerns for the safety of our volunteers led to the postponement of course ratings originally planned for the spring of 2020. By the fall, it became possible to conduct a few course ratings with modified procedures taken to allow physical distancing and otherwise minimize risk to our volunteers.

## Course Rating Workshop in 2021

As of the writing of this report, the nature and extent of COVID-19 restrictions that will be in effect in May and June of 2021 is not known.

## Member Club Course Ratings in 2021

The ability to safely conduct member club course ratings in 2021 is not known at this time. If golf courses can open in the spring under the same COVID-19 restrictions as were in effect at closing in the fall of 2020 it should be possible to conduct some course ratings in the spring. This would involve similar changes in procedure as were used in the rating of six courses in the fall of 2020 such as no car-pooling or cart-sharing except for volunteers already in the same “bubble” and physical distancing. Each volunteer course rater will, of course, have to assess his/her own personal situation with respect to participating in course ratings while COVID-19 is still a major concern. The status of conducting course ratings will be updated as more information becomes available.

## Interested in Volunteering as a Course Rater?

Any prospective volunteers should note most course ratings are conducted on weekdays in May and June. There may also be course ratings scheduled on weekdays in late August or September.

NOTE: The training of course rating volunteers involves a great deal of one-to-one mentoring of new volunteers by experienced course raters while in the field. Because this mentoring would be almost impossible under COVID-19 physical distancing restrictions, it seems unlikely that new volunteers will be accepted in 2021.

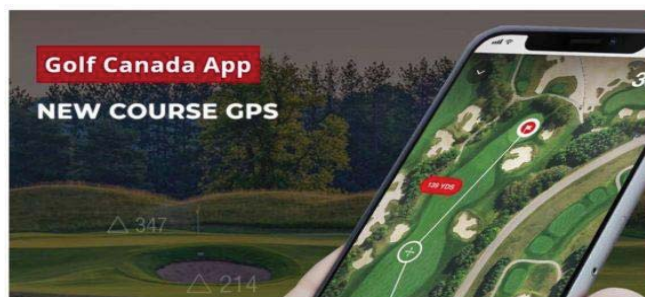

# HANDICAP COMMITTEE

## Purpose of the Golf Canada Handicap System

Handicapping is at the core of equitable competition in amateur golf, with few other sports enabling players to compete equitably across different skill levels the way that golf does. Golf Canada is the Authorized National body that is responsible for implementing and administering the Rules of Handicapping in Canada in co-operation with the provincial golf associations.



The purpose of the World Handicap System (WHS) is to make the game of golf more enjoyable for golfers by providing a consistent means of measuring one's performance and progress and to enable golfers of differing abilities to compete, or play a casual round, with anyone else on a fair and equal basis.

Through the WHS, each golfer establishes a "Handicap Index" which is the measure of a player's demonstrated ability on a course of standard playing difficulty.

The Handicap Index is calculated using the lowest 8 of the player's most recent 20 Score Differentials and updated with each new round played. The Handicap Index travels worldwide with the golfer from course to course (and tee to tee) and is used to calculate a "Course Handicap". The Course Handicap is the number of strokes a golfer receives from the specific set of tees at the course. The more difficult the golf course, the more strokes the golfer receives and vice versa.

The relative difficulty of a golf course is determined jointly by Golf Canada and the provincial golf association using the WHS Course Rating System as administered by Golf Canada. Specially trained Course Rating Teams evaluate the difficulty of a golf course based on such variables as length and a number of obstacle factors (e.g. topography, bunkers, lateral & crossing obstacles, severity of rough, etc).

Only Golf Canada member golf clubs are permitted to use the World Handicap System and Course Rating System (as administered by Golf Canada) including related trademarks and service marks. Member golf clubs must do so in a manner that preserves the integrity and reliability of these systems. All rights to use these systems and related trademarks and service marks terminate should the golf club cease to be a member in good standing with Golf Canada

## Golf Canada Score Centre

Post your golf scores, look up a golfers' handicap factor(s), find golf courses in Canada, compute your course handicap and more.

If you haven't downloaded the app for your iPhone or Android device, do so in 2021.

## Active Season and Posting of Scores

The handicap season for posting scores at Saskatchewan golf courses is April 15 to Oct. 31. All games played outside the active handicap season in Saskatchewan should not be posted for your handicap.

## Handicap Seminars and Licensing Agreements

There are three ways a club or individual can become certified under the handicap system:

1. attend a seminar in person, (pending COVID-19 restrictions being lifted),
2. attend a webinar, or
3. register and take the online handicap seminar via the Golf Canada website.

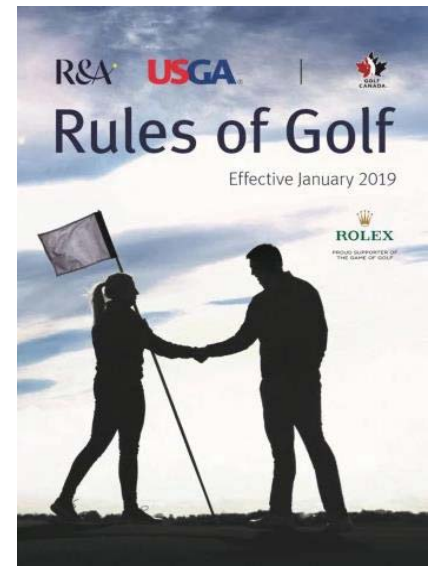
## Rules Education: Level 3, National Rules of Golf

## SPORT DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE



### EXCELLENCE – HIGH PERFORMANCE DEVELOPMENT TEAM

The High-Performance Development Team is a strategic measure under the excellence area of Golf Saskatchewan's strategic plan. The overall goal of the HPD Team is to perform better on the golf course, at events, be focused on the tasks at hand on and off the course and develop all aspects of their golf games. In 2020 we had two athletes take part in the HP training program. These players were introduced to a personalized fitness training program at Club 1621, mental training sessions, dieticians, and golf coaching and instruction from Steve Ryde.

The 2020 golf season proved to be a challenge for coaching, as private and group lessons were not permitted under the Government of Saskatchewan guidelines until mid-June. Zoom calls seemed to be the best and safest way to reach our developing golfers early in the season as we offered a series of webinars covering sport nutrition/fitness, the mental side of golf, and instructional videos added the Golf Saskatchewan YouTube channel.

In 2021 we are prepared and ready for what the golf season brings during the current pandemic. A re-designed Junior Development Program which will include all junior golfers that are eligible, parents, member facilities, and coaches to have access to this cost-effective program. The goal is to work with all the PGA of Saskatchewan members and member clubs to provide Saskatchewan's junior golfers the best in coaching and education.

### Coaching Development

The PGA of Canada's coaching program is developed in partnership with Golf Canada and the Coaching Association of Canada (CAC). The PGA of Canada is one of 67 sports participating in the National Coaching Certification Program (NCCP), representing coaching and instructing excellence in Canada. Golf Saskatchewan has made Coaching a strategic imperative. We have Steve Ryde (CNC) and Jason Schneider (CDC) to be the coaching leaders for our province and work with our High-Performance Development program and our Integrated Support Team. As of 2020 Saskatchewan has:

### Community Golf Coach

This workshop has been designed for the Community Golf Coach who is, or would like to, work with children or youth and is introducing the basic skills of golf. The overall goal of this workshop is to help prepare the coach to be competent in the skills required by a community coach. In 2020, the Community Golf Coach seminar was cancelled. The plans for 2021 are unknown as the PGA of Canada is working on a safe way to run the coaching seminar. Any updates for the Community Coaching stream will be communicated on our website and social media channels.



## National Athlete Assistance Subsidy (NAAS)

The Sport Development Committee believes in our athletes competing and excelling at the highest levels. In 2013, the National Athlete Assistance Subsidy program was revamped from an application process to an earned program. Following our provincial championships, athletes who qualify to attend nationals, either on teams/quota spots, are eligible to receive funding. The amount of subsidy is determined on an annual basis, however more dollars are allocated towards players who make the team spots. In 2020, there were no National events played therefore no NAAS were issued.

## PARTICIPATION – GROWING THE GAME

### Future Link Family of Programs



Future Links (presented provincially by SaskTel) gives children ages 6-18 the chance to enjoy and learn the game of golf via affordable and accessible programs that align and support the principles of golf's long-term player development guide, which

has been endorsed by Sport Canada. More than one million junior golfers have successfully participated in Future Links, Driven by Honda programming since its inception in 1996.

### National Golf in Schools:



This program has been developed for teachers to provide students the opportunity to develop aspects of “physical literacy” related to the sport of golf. The program also increases student knowledge and appreciation for the sport of golf.

In 2020, we introduced the Future Links Golf in Schools program to 8 elementary schools, and one high school into the program. Golf Saskatchewan's commitment to growing the sport is evident through this program. It would not be possible for Golf in Schools to have the success it has had without the school boards, schools, communities and member club's support. At the end of 2020, Golf in Schools reached 289 elementary schools, 16 intermediate schools and 53 high schools = **Total of 358.**

2020 brought many challenges as outside speakers were not permitted in any schools to offer programming. We produced a short video demonstrating how teachers can run their own golf clinics during gym class. This video can be viewed on the Golf Saskatchewan YouTube channel. It is a goal every year to contact as many of the GIS sites in Saskatchewan as possible to see how the program is working with their school, and if they would like any help with operating golf clinics.

Schools contacted our office or Golf Canada and purchased kits, others were chosen to receive a kit based on school budget shortfalls and some schools have been adopted by a club, golf professional, or local golfer.



2021 brings a large shift in programming as Golf Canada has decided to move away from the Future Links branding entirely. Partnering with First Tee in the US, together they have created a First Tee Canada headquarters with various provincial chapters. It is unknown if there will be a chapter in the prairies this season.

The Junior Skills Challenge will be a focus for Golf Saskatchewan moving forward as it provides a competitive atmosphere to young golfers that are interested in competition. The Junior Skills Challenge manual will be available to member facilities, which in turn can add it to their already successful program. We hope to run a series of regional events in various locations around the province, leading to a provincial skills challenge finale'.

Golf Saskatchewan will continue to provide golf clinics, private lessons, webinars, and development programs to the member clubs and players in our province.

In 2021 and beyond, changes will be happening to the Grow the Game initiatives.

## SAGE Scholarships

The program annually presents scholarships to assist deserving member golfers in their pursuit of high school and post-secondary academic excellence. The successful recipients are selected on their basis of academic excellence as well as some weighting of their golf participation. The two organizations who pay the scholarship amounts are Golf Saskatchewan and the Saskatoon Community Foundation.

The North American Indigenous Games 2020 was planning to take place in Halifax, N.S. from July 12-18, 2020. As of March 2020, and the COVID-19 pandemic, the games have been postponed being held in 2021. Updates for the next games and the team training and team selection will be announced later in 2021.



## Saskatchewan Summer Games

Nearly 2,000 athletes from nine district teams will compete in 14 different sports were supposed to converge on the city of Lloydminster this past summer. The Games were postponed due to COVID-19.

The Games provide an opportunity to leave a legacy in the community by updating and making improvements to recreation facilities, build community pride, and provide an opportunity for the province's top young athletes to compete in a top-notch multi-sport event.

- To develop collaborative partnerships within the community and province to enhance sport for young athletes.
- To provide opportunity for participants to develop themselves as athletes and people.
- To commit to a high level of participant care and comfort in all decision making.

- To demonstrate leadership through fiscal responsibility, accountability, and mentorship
- To create an opportunity to showcase Lloydminster and region to the province of Saskatchewan, thus enhancing the economic impact and to celebrate a spirit of inclusion.

### The Solo-Rider

Sometimes people cannot play golf due to mobility issues related to age, change in life situation, health deterioration or an accident. The Solo-Rider is turning what used to be thought of as impossibility, into a reality. Athletes who have a mobility issue can now enjoy the stable, comfortable, and fun way to get back in the game.

The specialty cart enables golfers to continue to enjoy the game of golf or take it up for the first time. Golf Saskatchewan, through funding from Sask Sport Inc. and the Para-Sport grant now owns two Solo-Ride power-carts. The Solo-Riders are in Saskatoon, at the Silverwood Golf Course and in Regina, at the Royal Regina Golf Club.

There is no cost to rent the Solo-Rider other than the cost of a green fee for the participant.

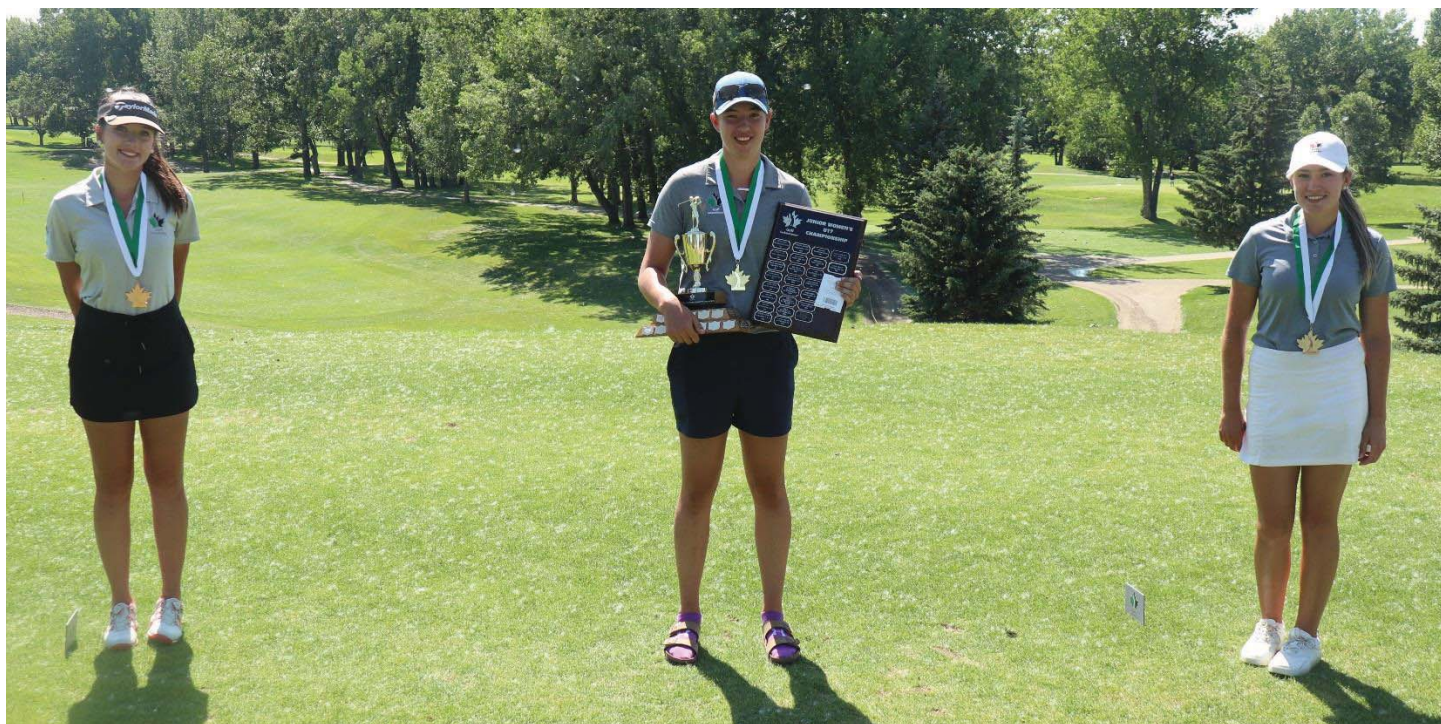

## INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

### To the Members, Golf Saskatchewan

#### *Opinion*

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of **Saskatchewan Golf Association Inc.** operating as **Golf Saskatchewan** which comprise the statement of financial position as at December 31, 2020, and the statements of operations, changes in net assets and cash flows for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

In our opinion, these financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Association as at December 31, 2020 and the results of its operations and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations.

#### *Basis for Opinion*

We conducted our audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the Association in accordance with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements in Saskatchewan, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

#### *Information Other than the Financial Statements and Auditors' Report Thereon*

Management is responsible for the other information. The other information comprises the information included in the annual report but does not include the financial statements and our auditors' report thereon. The annual report is expected to be made available to us after the date of this auditors' report.

Our opinion on the financial statements does not cover the other information and we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the financial statements, our responsibility is to read the other information identified above when it becomes available and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the financial statements or our knowledge obtained in the audit, or otherwise appears to be materially misstated.

When we read the annual report, if we conclude that there is a material misstatement therein, we are required to communicate the matter to those charged with governance.

#### *Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance for the Financial Statements*

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations, and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the Association's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the Association or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the Association's financial reporting process.

### *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements*

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

As part of an audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. **1. Description of operations**

Saskatchewan Golf Association Inc. ("Golf Saskatchewan" or the "Association") was incorporated under the *Non-profit Corporations Act, 1995* of Saskatchewan. The Association promotes and coordinates amateur golf in the province of Saskatchewan. The Association is exempt from income taxes under Section 149(1)(l) of the *Income Tax Act*.

**2. Summary of significant accounting policies**

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations. The financial statements required management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amount of revenues and expenses during the period. These estimates are reviewed periodically, and, as adjustments become necessary, they are reported in earnings in the period in which they become known. The financial statements reflect the following policies:

**Financial instruments – recognition and measurement**

Financial assets and financial liabilities are recorded on the statement of financial position when the Association becomes party to the contractual provisions of the financial instrument. All financial instruments are required to be recognized at fair value upon initial recognition, except for certain related party transactions. All other financial assets, except for investments, and financial liabilities are subsequently measured at amortized cost adjusted by transaction costs, which are amortized over the expected life of the instrument. Investments are measured at fair value.

Fair value is the amount at which a financial instrument could be exchanged at arm's length between willing, unrelated parties in an open market. Changes in fair values of financial assets and financial liabilities measured at fair value are recognized in excess of revenues over expenses.

When there is an indication of impairment and such impairment is determined to have occurred, the carrying amount of financial assets measured at amortized cost is reduced to the greater of the discounted cash flows expected or the proceeds that could be realized from sale of the financial asset. Such impairments can be subsequently reversed if the value subsequently improves.

**Inventory**

Inventory is recorded at the lower of cost and net realizable value. Cost is determined based on the specific identification method.

**Tangible capital assets**

Tangible capital assets are recorded at cost less accumulated amortization. Amortization is provided on a declining balance basis over the estimated useful life of the assets at the following annual rates:

**2. Summary of significant accounting policies (continued)**

**Funds**

The Golf Hall of Fame fund is an internally restricted fund established to hold funds raised in support of a Saskatchewan golf hall of fame.

**Revenue recognition**

The Association follows the deferral method of accounting for contributions. Restricted contributions are recognized as revenue in the year in which related expenses are incurred. Unrestricted contributions are recognized as revenue when received or receivable, if the amount can be reasonably estimated and collections are assured. Revenues received from the Saskatchewan Lotteries Trust Fund for Sport, Culture and Recreation are recorded as revenue in year to which the funding relates. Membership fees are recognized in the membership year, which coincides with the Association's fiscal year. Revenues from tournaments, clinics and are recognized when the event occurs. Investment revenue is recognized as it is earned. Fundraising and donation revenues are recognized when they are received.

**Donations in kind**

Donations of material and services are recorded at fair market value when received if the amount can be reasonably estimated and would otherwise have been purchased.

**Contributed services**

The work of Golf Saskatchewan is dependent on the services of many volunteers at amateur events as well as for the governance council and various committees. Since these services are not normally purchased and because of the difficulty in determining their fair value, donated services are not recorded in the statement of operations.

The RBC A+ Unified Managed Account is a structure which provides access to multiple investment managers within one account. The asset allocation of the account at year end was 49% equities and 48% fixed income (2019 – 48% equities and 48% fixed income), with an emphasis on high quality securities, income generation, downside protection and capital preservation.

At December 31, 2020, the asset allocation in the account was \$14,103 in cash, \$235,466 in fixed income and \$242,368 in equities. At December 31, 2019, the asset allocation in the account was \$14,082 in cash, \$226,212 in fixed income and \$226,123 in equities.

**5. Sport Legacy Fund**

The cash surrender value of the life insurance policy and investment in the Sport Legacy Fund consists of donations based on various programs and contributions by Sask Sport. These amounts are recorded as deferred revenue until amounts have been received. To qualify for an additional contribution by Sask Sport Inc., the Association is required to leave the original amount and any additional donations in the Legacy Fund for a minimum of five years.

**6. Deferred revenue**

During 2020, the Association received \$213,850 (2019 – \$224,200) from the Saskatchewan Lotteries Trust Fund for annual expenses which will occur in the following fiscal year. Deferred revenue includes the funds invested with the Sport Legacy Fund of \$9,878 (2019 – \$9,318), unspent Indigenous Sport Enhancement grant funds of \$1,464 (2019 - \$5,856) and unspent Adaptive Sport Equipment grant funds of \$13,000 (2019 - \$0).

**7. Economic dependence**

Golf Saskatchewan currently receives revenue in grants from Saskatchewan Lotteries Trust Fund for Sport, Culture and Recreation. As a result, the Association is dependent upon the continuance of these grants to maintain operations at their current level.

**8. Financial instruments**

The Association recognized financial instruments consist of cash, accounts receivable, accounts payable, accrued liabilities and investments. The fair value of cash, accounts receivable, accounts payable, accrued liabilities and investments approximate their carrying value given the short-term nature of the amounts.

**9. Financial risk management**

The significant financial risks to which the Association is exposed are:

**Credit risk**

Credit risk is the risk that one party to a financial instrument will cause a financial loss for the other party by failing to discharge an obligation. The Association is exposed to credit risk on the accounts receivable from its customers, however, does not have a significant exposure to any individual customer or member. The Association incurred \$0 (2019 - \$2,147) in bad debt expense in the current year. The Association's customers are mainly members of the Association.

**Liquidity risk**

Liquidity risk is the risk that an entity will encounter difficulty in meeting obligations associated with financial liabilities. The Association's exposure to liquidity risk is dependent on the receipt of funds from its operations and other related sources. Funds from these sources are primarily used to finance working capital and capital expenditure requirements and are considered adequate to meet the Association's financial obligations.

**Price risk**

Price risk is the risk that the fair value or future cash flows of a financial instrument will fluctuate because of changes in market prices. The Association's investments in publically traded securities expose the Association to market price risk as such investments are subject to price changes in the open market. The Association does not use any derivative financial instruments to alter the effects of this risk.

**10. Contributed materials**

During the year, the Association received donated golf products estimated at a value of \$20,000 (2019 - \$20,000).

**11. Significant event**

On March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization declared a global pandemic for the COVID-19 virus. The Association continues to follow health advisories and mandatory requirements from local, provincial and national health and government organizations. The Association has continued to provide services to its members, although in person activities have been greatly reduced. The future impact of the pandemic on the Association's operations and finances, if any, is unknown at this time.

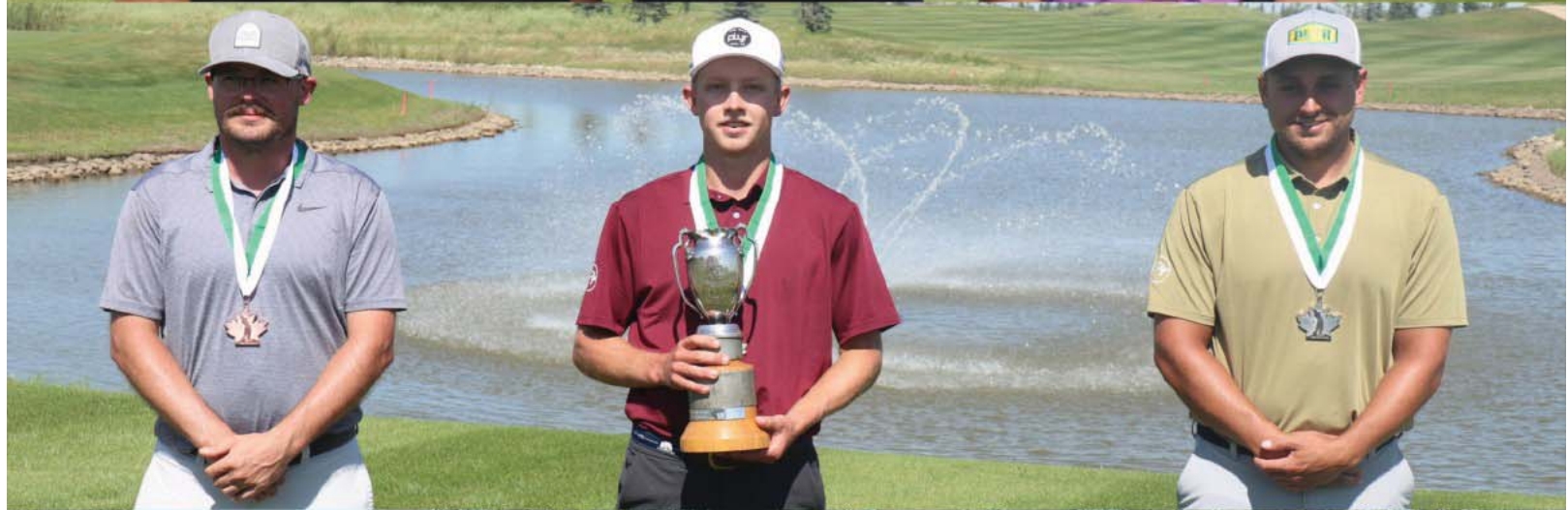
