TYLER WRIGHT

Tyler Wright began his outstanding amateur golf career as a junior in Regina. In 1993 he was on the gold medal Saskatchewan Summer Games golf team and won the 13and-under title. He was a Saskatchewan juvenile team member in 1995, the Regina High School and City Junior Champion in 1995 and 1997 and the provincial high school champion in 1996. Upon finishing high school Tyler received the Lorne Aston Award for an athlete who maintained a high academic average while competing in his chosen sport and contributing to the betterment of his community. He also received a golf scholarship to Idaho State University and the Leddy-Heywood Scholarship from Golf Saskatchewan twice. Furthering his education at the University of Regina he graduated with the prestigious



President's Award given to a student athlete who succeeds at the national level in his sport (basketball) as well as academics.

Tyler holds Saskatchewan golf titles of 2017 Men's Amateur Champion and 2014 and 2016 Mid-Amateur Champion. He has competed nationally as a member of the Saskatchewan Willingdon Cup team in 2001, 2005, 2014, 2015 and 2017, and five more nationals as a member of the Saskatchewan Mid-Amateur team (2007, 2008, 2014, 2016, 2017). At Wascana Country Club in 2017 Tyler was thrilled to finish fifth as this was the best finish ever for a Saskatchewan golfer. Team Saskatchewan finished tied for first but lost the playoff to Ontario. He won the Saskatchewan Mid-Masters in August of this year. Tyler has enjoyed representing Saskatchewan in national competitions and gives credit to Golf Saskatchewan for the support he has received.

At the city level Tyler won the Regina Amateur Championship in 2001 and 2002 and was on the winning Regina four-man team three times. He was the Royal Regina club champion three times and currently plays out of Wascana. His remarkable accomplishments include winning more than thirty tournaments and scoring five holes-in-one.

Tyler's disciplined practices, his ability to control his emotions under pressure and his attention to managing the golf course have all contributed to his success. He is noted for his sportsmanship and exemplary conduct. He has given back to the community through raising money for sports programs over the past fifteen years. Tyler is currently vice-principal at Archbishop M.C. O'Neill High School. His recent masters' thesis focused on making systemic changes to schools to create a better place for indigenous staff and students.

Tyler and his wife Jennifer have two daughters, Scarlett and Indyana.

In 2015 Tyler was inducted into the Regina Sports Hall of Fame for both golf and basketball at the same time as his father, Larry, was inducted for his hockey career. Congratulations to Tyler Wright on his induction into the Saskatchewan Golf Hall of Fame as an outstanding amateur golf player.
