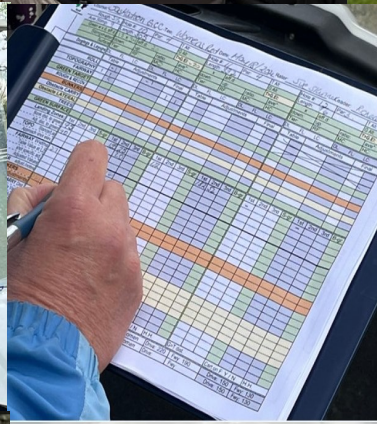
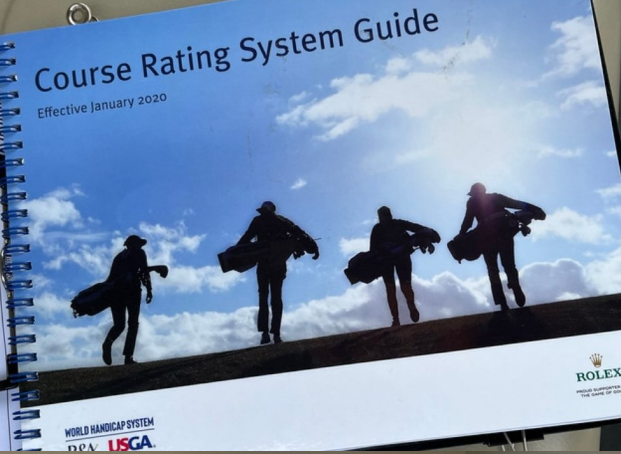

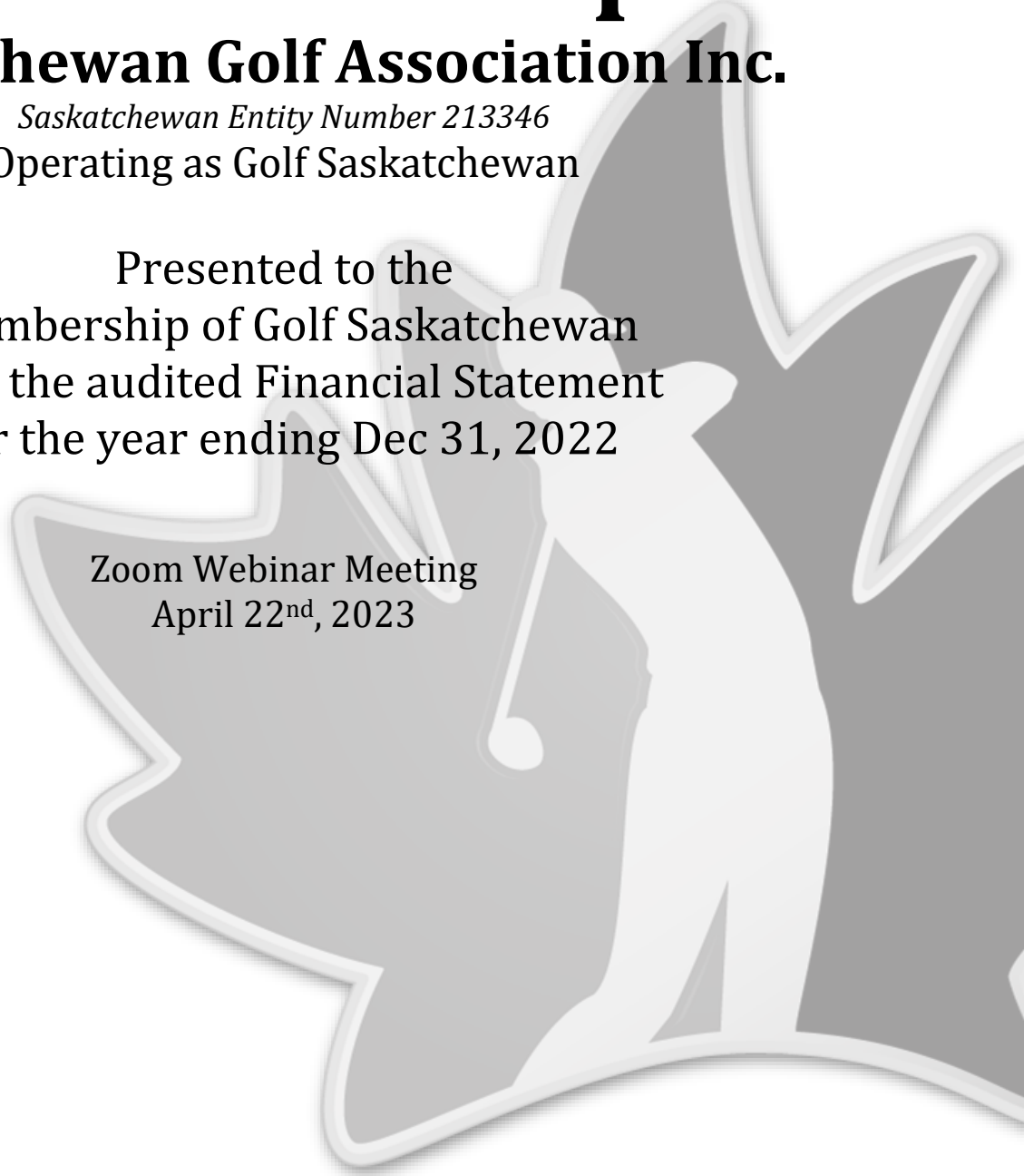

Support from our member clubs hosting our events has been excellent. Welcome to the 2023 annual general meeting (AGM) of the Saskatchewan Golf Association Inc. operating as Golf Saskatchewan, it's great to be joined again by a widespread audience virtually. Before we tee it up for 2023 our organization wishes to celebrate many accomplishments this past season.

The Elk Ridge Open returned with a field full of PGA TOUR Canada professionals, as well as Saskatchewan's Kade Johnson and Roman Timmerman. Unfortunately, rain forced the stoppage of the event, however, it will return to Elk Ridge Resort in June 2023.

Golf Saskatchewan finished an exciting provincial season with a new event in Warman, the Champions Cup. Team Wascana won the inaugural team/individual one-day 18-hole tournament. The Rosebowl Championship was not held due to low entries however we believe a Saskatoon-area host (Moon Lake Golf & Country Club) will assist in reviving the historic tournament. Overall, 64 more players participated in our provincial events in 2022.








Golf Saskatchewan welcomed back the following courses into membership in 2022: Madge Lake Golf Resort and Manitou Beach Golf Club. Welcome to all the members at these clubs and we encourage our membership to schedule a trip and try these wonderful facilities in 2023.

For the first time in several years Golf Saskatchewan provided coaches (Steve Ryde/Anna Young) to assist the junior women and men's teams at their respective national championships. Another key highlight was the first women's golf camp at Elk Ridge. The weekend event sold out, and we have plans for expansion in 2023 with a southern camp. Please stay tuned!

Golf Saskatchewan continues to work with inclusive groups promoting the sport including Special Olympics, Para-Golf Activities, supporting Blind Sports, including blind golfer (Gerry Nelson who recently won the US Blind Golf Championship), All-Abilities athletes and more.

Rounds played and posted for handicapping purposes were down slightly in 2022 to 246,000 (from 255,000). Many courses were reporting record years with golf's continued growth and the full return of tournaments and shotgun starts, without any COVID-19 restrictions.

Of course, none of the above highlights are possible without the assistance of many people from across our amazing province and support from across Canada.

Membership Assistance Program (MAP Grants)

The purpose of the Membership Assistance Program (MAP) grant is to provide financial assistance to Golf Saskatchewan registered affiliated clubs so they may operate programs encouraging and promoting community and club level sport development in their local area. Development of these programs and services will increase membership in Golf Saskatchewan and the local member organizations. MAP is funded by the Saskatchewan Lotteries Trust Fund for Sport, Culture & Recreation and is derived from the sale of lottery tickets in Saskatchewan.

In 2022, Golf Saskatchewan distributed \$99,400 in MAP Grants to 56 member clubs. A complete break-down of the clubs and the MAP funding from 2022 can be found in the Audited Financial Statements (Schedule 7) of the audited financial statements.

In 2023, \$100,300 will be distributed to Member Clubs. Since we began tracking the distributed MAP GRANTS funds in 2001, approximately \$1.75 million has been allotted to member clubs. Thank you for the continued support in growing member participation in golf and remember to purchase your lottery tickets.

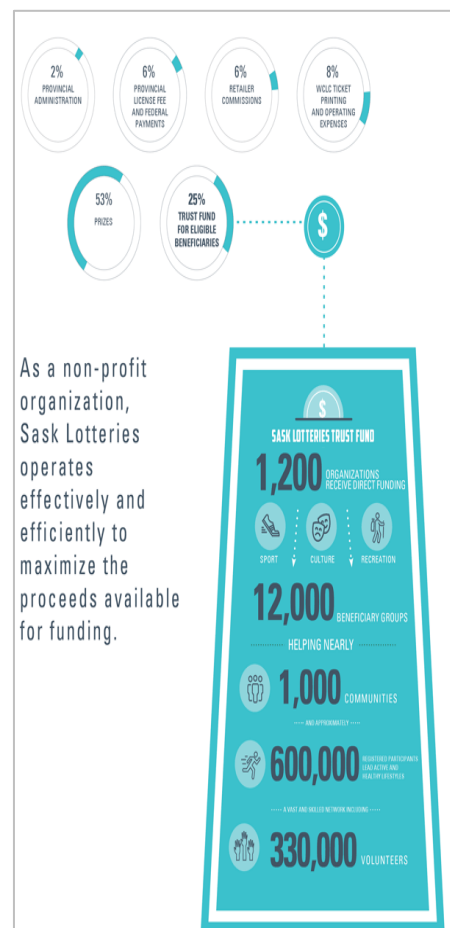

Golf Canada - Incident Protection Program

In 2022, 34 Golf Saskatchewan members submit claims under the Incident Protection Program (IPP) valued at \$30,615 in damages, theft, or loss. This was double the losses paid out in comparison to the previous year (2021). The items included a combination of equipment damage, loss or theft, broken glass, golf cart damage or the program paying the deductible on a member's home insurance for items above the valued threshold. In 2023, we will continue to update our membership about the incident protection program.

-  2022 = 34 claims valued at an estimated \$30,615 in damages, theft, or loss.
-  2021 = 22 claims valued at an estimated \$15,166 in damages, theft, or loss.
-  2020 = 17 incidents | 7,504
-  2019 = 20 incidents | \$11,262
-  2018 = 17 incidents | \$11,310

FINANCE COMMITTEE



I am pleased to present the financial report for 2022 for the year ending Dec 31st, 2021. VIRTUS GROUP has completed the annual audit of the financial statements of Golf Saskatchewan. In VIRTUS Group's opinion, management maintains an appropriate system of internal accounting controls ensure the transactions are accurately recorded on a timely basis, are properly approved and result in reliable financial statements. Management and the Board of Directors acknowledge the financial statements are their responsibility.

The Finance Committee, composed of members of the Board of Directors, meets with the management of Golf Saskatchewan to ensure accuracy of the association's financial reports. The Board of Directors has **voted to approve** the financial statements as presented in Appendix I of the annual report, March of 2023.

The financial highlights are:

- i. **Revenues** of \$974,688: an overall decrease of approximately 10% or \$106,000 compared to 2021.
 - o The decreases are in not receiving any Covid-19 grant(s).
- ii. **Expenses** of \$1,028,638: a decrease of approximately 2% or \$19,679 comparable to the previous year.

The Expense Schedules shown below are detailed in the audited financial statements at the end of the report.

- iii. **Administration (Schedule 3)** increased approximately 1% or \$2,728. (Operational expenses)
- iv. **Capacity and Interaction (Schedule 4)** increased approximately 103% or \$19,096. (Awards, recognition, and meetings)
- v. **Participation and Interaction (Schedule 5)** increased approximately 27% or \$32,000. (Championships)
- vi. **Excellence (Schedule 6)** increased approximately 74% or \$36,000. (National championships, Coaching)
- vii. **MAP GRANT (Schedule 7)** flow through expenses from the LTF grant for membership programming.
- viii. **Heritage Canada Covid-19 Relief Funding** – no COVID funding was received in 2022.

The overall result is a **\$53,950 deficit*** of revenues over expenses and therefore a decrease in the reserves (unrestricted net assets).

NOTES FOR MEMBERSHIP REGARDING THE GOLF SASKATCHEWAN BUDGETING PROCESS:

1. Board/management does not include grant revenues unless they have officially been announced/received.
2. For the 2022 Fiscal Year the Board of Directors (BOD) approved a strategic surplus budget of **\$240**
 - a. Budget = forecasted expenses = \$1,014,710 compared to revenues = \$1,014,950.
 - b. Actual = Expenses = \$1,028,638 compared to Actual Revenues = \$947,688.
3. Reminder to membership: if the BOD approves a deficit budget, it does not impact Golf Saskatchewan's overall financial position due to strong reserve funds.
4. Limited interest can be accounted in our general operating funds however the practice is not used.
5. In 2021, one of our strategic goals/measures was accomplished → \$0 budget in less than three years.

Thank you to the Golf Saskatchewan staff/management, Board of Directors, and the Finance Committee for their contributions during the past year.

COURSE RATING COMMITTEE

The Course Rating System consists of two basic elements:

Course Rating – the evaluation of the playing difficulty of a course for scratch golfers under normal course and weather conditions expressed as number of strokes (e.g. 72.5).

Slope Rating – the evaluation of the relative difficulty of a course for players who are not scratch golfers compared to the difficulty of the course for scratch golfers. The lowest Slope Rating is 55 and the highest 155. A course of standard playing difficulty will have a Slope Rating of 113.

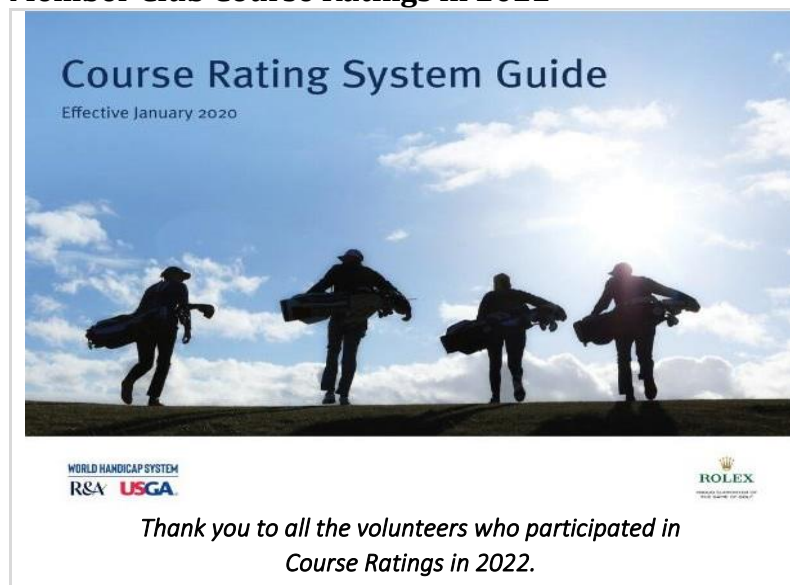
Accuracy and consistency are the keys to effective course rating. Golf Canada and the provincial golf associations work together to rate golf courses and ensure that Course Ratings are accurate and uniform from coast to coast. Only Golf Canada authorized provincial golf associations may rate golf courses. If a club disagrees with its ratings, it may request that the provincial golf association review the ratings.

Course Rating Seminar

The annual course rating seminar returned to an in-person format in 2022, held in Saskatoon May 16 & 17. Although the seminar was in-person for the Golf Saskatchewan volunteers, it was also available online for other participants. The seminar was attended by 15 Golf Saskatchewan volunteers and online by 11 volunteers and staff from other provinces. Following the seminar, the Saskatchewan volunteers conducted the Course Rating of the Saskatoon Golf & Country Club on May 18.

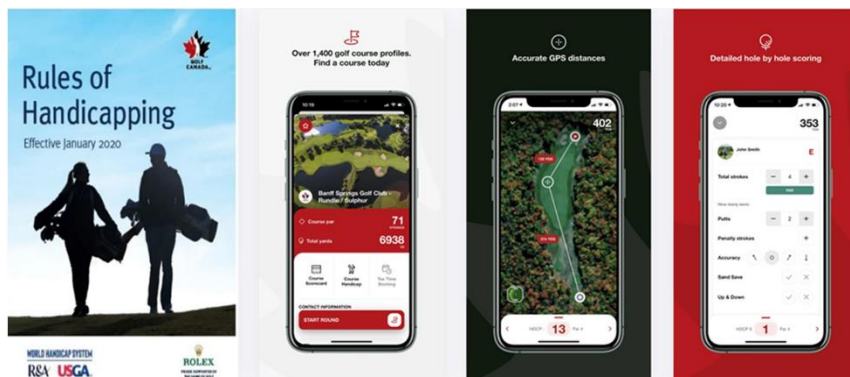

WORLD HANDICAP SYSTEM (WHS) | RULES OF HANDICAPPING

Purpose of the Golf Canada Handicap System



Handicapping is at the core of equitable competition in amateur golf, with few other sports enabling players to compete equitably across different skill levels the way that golf does. Golf Canada is the Authorized National body that is responsible for implementing and administering the Rules of Handicapping in Canada in co-operation with the provincial golf associations.

The purpose of the World Handicap System (WHS) is to make the game of golf more

enjoyable for golfers by providing a consistent means of measuring one's performance and progress and to enable golfers of differing abilities to compete, or play a casual round, with anyone else on a fair and equal basis.

Through the WHS, each golfer establishes a "Handicap Index" which is the measure of a player's demonstrated ability on a course of standard playing difficulty.

The Handicap Index is calculated using the lowest 8 of the player's most recent 20 Score Differentials and updated with each new round played. The Handicap Index travels worldwide with the golfer from course to course (and tee to tee) and is used to calculate a "Course Handicap". The Course Handicap is the number of strokes a golfer receives from the specific set of tees at the course. The more difficult the golf course, the more strokes the golfer receives and vice versa.

The relative difficulty of a golf course is determined jointly by Golf Canada and the provincial golf association using the WHS Course Rating System as administered by Golf Canada. Specially trained Course Rating Teams evaluate the difficulty of a golf course based on such variables as length and a number of obstacle factors (e.g. topography, bunkers, lateral & crossing obstacles, severity of rough, etc.).

Only Golf Canada member golf clubs are permitted to use the World Handicap System and Course Rating System (as administered by Golf Canada) including related trademarks and service marks. Member golf clubs must do so in a manner that preserves the integrity and reliability of these systems. All rights to use these systems and related trademarks and service marks terminate should the golf club cease to be a member in good standing with Golf Canada.

Golf Canada Score Centre

Post your golf scores, look up a golfers' handicap factor(s), find golf courses in Canada, compute your course handicap and more.

If you haven't downloaded the app for your iPhone or Android device, do so in 2023.

Active Season and Posting of Scores

The handicap season for posting scores at Saskatchewan golf courses is April 15 to Oct. 31. All games played outside the active handicap season in Saskatchewan should not be posted for your handicap.

Handicap Seminars and Licensing Agreements

There are three ways a club or individual can become certified under the WHS:

1. attend a seminar in person,
2. attend a webinar, or
3. register and take the online handicap seminar via the [Golf Canada website](#).

For clubs, please sign and return/submit the WHS Licensing Agreement as soon as possible.

Rules of Golf 2023 NEW Edition:

Effective January 2023: As the governing body of golf in Canada, Golf Canada holds the exclusive right to govern, publish and distribute the Rules of Golf in Canada. The Rules are typically updated every four years through the work of the R&A and the United States Golf Association. A joint committee of these associations, on which the Chair of Golf Canada's Rules and Amateur Status Committee sits, is charged with revising, modernizing, and improving the Rules of Golf.

Amateur Status

The Amateur Status Committee of Golf Canada defines an amateur as someone who plays the game as a non-remunerative and non-profit-making sport and who does not receive remuneration for teaching golf or for other activities because of golf skill or reputation.

Prizes in amateur events are limited to a retail value of \$1000. Yet players may receive expenses to play in competitions, accept golf scholarships and make inquiries as to the possibilities of becoming a professional, including playing in a qualifying event provided, if prize money is available, a waiver to any prize money is signed prior to playing.

The purpose and spirit of the rules is to keep the amateur game as free as possible from the abuses which may follow from uncontrolled sponsorship and financial incentive and to safeguard the rules of play and handicapping so that golf can be fully enjoyed by all amateur golfers.

What is a Net Double Bogey?

Under the World Handicap System (WHS), the maximum score your golfers can post per hole changed in 2019. A Net Double Bogey represents how many strokes a golfer can take on a given hole by applying their Course Handicap for that set of tees.

SPORT COMMITTEE

EXCELLENCE – JUNIOR DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM (JDP)

The Junior Development program is a measure under the excellence area of Golf Saskatchewan's strategic plan. The goal is to create a culture of hard work, commitment and dedication among all athletes, coaches, and the integrated sports teams (IST). Athletes will learn to practice, train, and play with a game plan. We want to excel as a group and work with those who share the same goals to succeed at the provincial and national levels.

In 2022, the JDP directed by PGA of Canada coach, Steve Ryde, as were introduced to personalized fitness training program/body assessment with Adrian Cochet, of Optimized Golf, a TPI Certified physio therapist. In-person training at the Golf Dome in Saskatoon and the Willows GC camp. Others enjoyed the online webinar series offering free mental training sessions from Lisa Hoffart, expert advice on nutrition recovery with Heather Hynes, and rules of golf trivia with coach Steve.

The JDP also took a bus to the Golf Canada NextGen Regional Championship, outside of Winnipeg in June 2022. See the results and photo below in the Golf Canada championship results.

The goal in 2023 is to continue working with PGA of Saskatchewan members, certified fitness/nutrition specialists, and member clubs to provide Saskatchewan's junior golfers' the best in coaching and education from leaders in the golf industry.

Coaching Development

The PGA of Canada's coaching program is developed in partnership with Golf Canada and the Coaching Association of Canada (CAC). The PGA of Canada is one of 67 sports participating in the National Coaching Certification Program (NCCP), representing coaching and instructing excellence in Canada. In 2022, Steve Ryde completed the requirements of the CDC program. As of 2022 Saskatchewan has:

Golf Canada partnered with First Tee, together they have created a First Tee Canada headquarters with various provincial chapters. First Tee – Prairies is now in operation however we will still do community outreach.

First Tee Coach Education is delivered to aspiring Coaches in Canada jointly by First Tee and PGA of Canada. This collaborative partnership enables Coaches working through First Tee Coach Education Pathway to choose their own level of involvement. Note: All coaches begin the pathway by completing Safe Sport Prerequisites.

National Athlete Assistance Subsidy (NAAS)

Since 1999, (when the CLGA of Saskatchewan and SGA amalgamated into one association), Golf Saskatchewan has provided more than **\$1 million dollars (\$1,112,808)** in combined Athlete Assistance and funding towards national championships. The Sport Development Committee believes in our athletes competing and excelling at the highest levels. In 2013, the National Athlete Assistance Subsidy program was revamped from an application process to an earned program.

So how does a player qualify for NAAS? Play in our championships and commit to playing at nationals. Following our provincial championships, athletes who qualify to attend nationals, either on teams or quota spots, are eligible to receive funding. The amount of subsidy is determined on an annual basis, however more dollars are allocated towards players who make the team spots (those who medal). The remainder of the funds are shared with the remaining quota spot players.



PARTICIPATION – GROWING THE GAME

Junior-Junior



With the help of the host committee at the Royal Regina Golf Club, the two-day event was added to the Junior Championships for the second straight year after the debut of the 'Junior-Junior' (JR-JR) in 2021 at Hillcrest Golf Club. The goal of the event is to introduce kids to competitive golf, providing a fun, learning experience for golfers under the age of thirteen and introduce players of that age to multi-day events. There were 17 participants in this fun, Stableford format tournament.

The JR-JR will be an annual event alongside the junior provincial championships moving forward.

Junior Skills Challenge (JSC)



JSC is an online and interactive program focusing on developing the key golf skills of putting, chipping, and driving. The [online leaderboard](#) allows instructors to upload players' scores so they can track their improvement. Using the data, players are ranked nationally by age group, and by scores on the National Leaderboard. Top competitors nationally are invited to compete in the annual Junior Skills Challenge National Event.

In 2022, Golf Saskatchewan hosted JSC's at Wildwood Golf Course in Saskatoon and Deer Valley Golf Club to assist junior development. The Junior Skills Challenge will continue to be a focus for Golf Saskatchewan in 2023, as it provides a competitive atmosphere to young golfers that are interested in competition. The Junior Skills Challenge manual will be available to member facilities, which in turn can add it to their already successful program. We hope to run a series of regional events in various locations around the province, leading to a provincial skills challenge finale'.

Learn-to-Play (LTP)



The LTP is an after-school program designed for member facilities to grow their junior memberships at the local level. Juniors will learn key fundamentals in golf, then go play a few holes while learning on course etiquette and Rules of Golf. Coach Steve Ryde assisted in the LTP program at member facilities, including Valleyview Golf and Country Club in Delisle, Outlook Riverview Golf Club, Perdue Oasis Golf Club in Biggar.

Golf Saskatchewan will continue to provide golf clinics, private lessons, webinars, and development programs to the member clubs and players in our province.

Women's Golf Camp



Golf Saskatchewan partnered with Elk Ridge Resort and a trio of PGA of Canada coaches to host the inaugural Ladies Golf Camp this past July. Golf Saskatchewan Manager of Sport Development Steve Ryde was joined by Patty Jonas, Anna Young, and Elk Ridge Head Professional Ryan Wells. to lead the sold-out event.

The camp was for Women of every skill level and focused on fun, game fundamentals, in an entertaining and safe atmosphere.

Angie Carriere was one of the participants alongside her sister Shelly Carriere and friend Jacqueline Archer. Carriere spoke about the experience and urges others to participate in future camps or even search locally for golf programming if you want to give the sport a try.

We are planning on holding a 2023 Women's Camp at Elk Ridge, if everything lines up, and potentially expanding the program in the south at a location such as Golf Kenosee. Please watch our website for updates on this program.

SAGE Scholarships & High School Bursaries

The program annually presents scholarships to assist deserving member golfers in their pursuit of high school and post-secondary academic excellence. The successful recipients are selected based on academic excellence as well as some weighting of their golf participation. 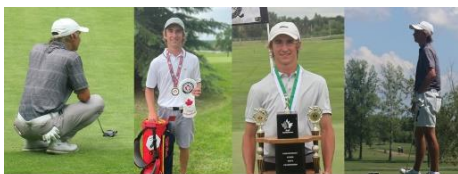

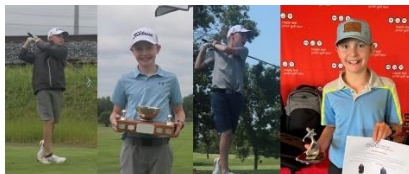

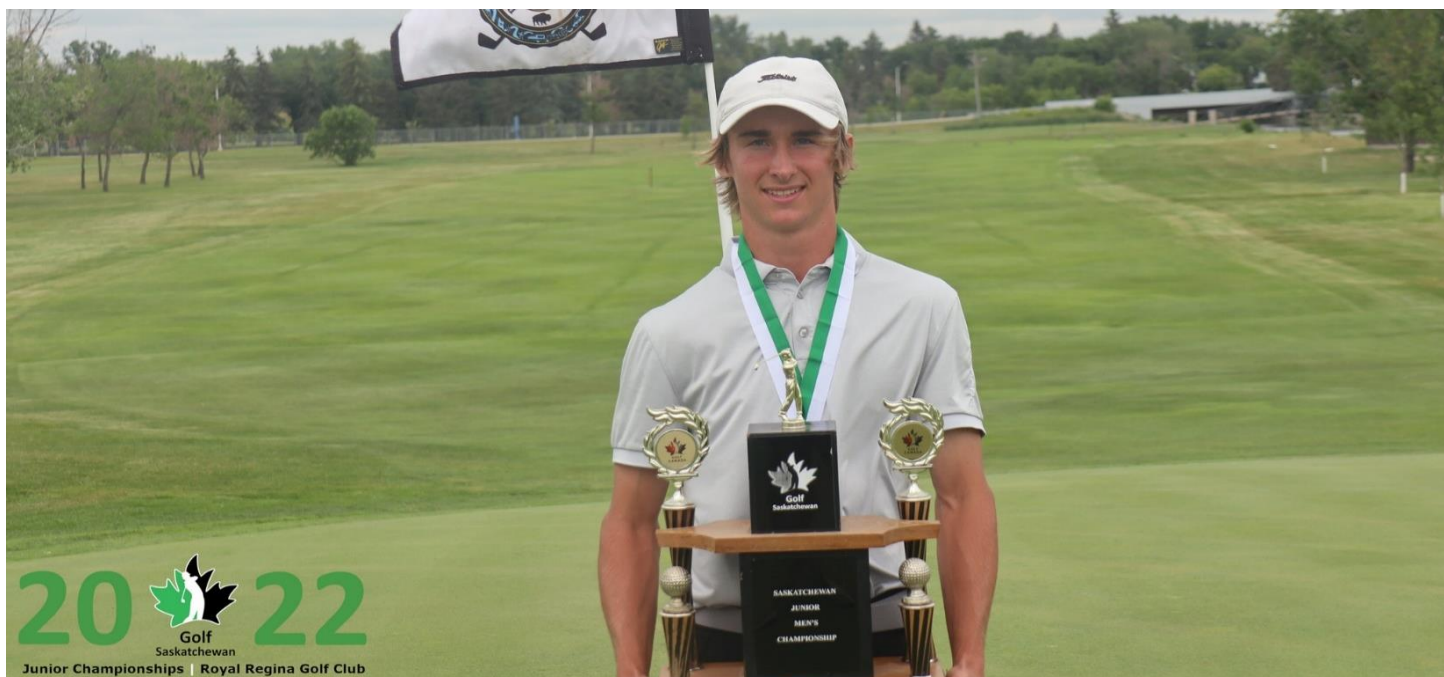

Opinion

1. Description of operations

Saskatchewan Golf Association Inc. ("Golf Saskatchewan" or the "Association") is continued under the *Non-profit Corporations Act, 2022* of Saskatchewan. The Association promotes and coordinates amateur golf in the province of Saskatchewan. The Association is exempt from income taxes under Section 149(1)(l) of the *Income Tax Act*.

2. Summary of significant accounting policies

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations. The financial statements required management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amount of revenues and expenses during the period. These estimates are reviewed periodically, and, as adjustments become necessary, they are reported in earnings in the period in which they become known. The financial statements reflect the following policies:

Financial instruments – recognition and measurement

Financial assets and financial liabilities are recorded on the statement of financial position when the Association becomes party to the contractual provisions of the financial instrument. All financial instruments are required to be recognized at fair value upon initial recognition, except for certain related party transactions. All other financial assets, except for investments, and financial liabilities are subsequently measured at amortized cost adjusted by transaction costs, which are amortized over the expected life of the instrument. Investments are measured at fair value.

Fair value is the amount at which a financial instrument could be exchanged at arm's length between willing, unrelated parties in an open market. Changes in fair values of financial assets and financial liabilities measured at fair value are recognized in excess of revenues over expenses.

When there is an indication of impairment and such impairment is determined to have occurred, the carrying amount of financial assets measured at amortized cost is reduced to the greater of the discounted cash flows expected or the proceeds that could be realized from sale of the financial asset. Such impairments can be subsequently reversed if the value subsequently improves.

Inventory

Inventory is recorded at the lower of cost and net realizable value. Cost is determined based on the specific identification method.

Tangible capital assets

Tangible capital assets are recorded at cost less accumulated amortization. Amortization is provided on a declining balance basis over the estimated useful life of the assets at the following annual rates:

2. Summary of significant accounting policies (continued)

Funds

The Golf Hall of Fame fund is an internally restricted fund established to hold funds raised in support of a Saskatchewan golf hall of fame.

Revenue recognition

The Association follows the deferral method of accounting for contributions. Restricted contributions are recognized as revenue in the year in which related expenses are incurred. Unrestricted contributions are recognized as revenue when received or receivable, if the amount can be reasonably estimated and collections are assured. Revenues received from the Saskatchewan Lotteries Trust Fund for Sport, Culture and Recreation are recorded as revenue in year to which the funding relates. Membership fees are recognized in the membership year, which coincides with the Association's fiscal year. Revenues from tournaments, and clinics are recognized when the event occurs. Investment revenue is recognized as it is earned. Fundraising and donation revenues are recognized when they are received.

Donations in kind

Donations of material and services are recorded at fair market value when received if the amount can be reasonably estimated and would otherwise have been purchased.

Contributed services

The work of Golf Saskatchewan is dependent on the services of many volunteers at amateur events as well as for the governance council and various committees. Since these services are not normally purchased and because of the difficulty in determining their fair value, donated services are not recorded in the statement of operations.

The RBC A+ Unified Managed Account is a structure which provides access to multiple investment managers within one account. The asset allocation of the account at year end was 49% equities and 48% fixed income (2021 – 47% equities and 48% fixed income), with an emphasis on high quality securities, income generation, downside protection and capital preservation.

At December 31, 2022, the asset allocation in the account was \$12,675 in cash, \$230,714 in fixed income and \$241,959 in equities. At December 31, 2021, the asset allocation in the account was \$18,950 in cash, \$258,996 in fixed income and \$253,830 in equities.

5. Sport Legacy Fund

The cash surrender value of the life insurance policy and investment in the Sport Legacy Fund consists of donations based on various programs and contributions by Sask Sport. These amounts are recorded as deferred revenue until amounts have been received. To qualify for an additional contribution by Sask Sport Inc., the Association is required to leave the original amount and any additional donations in the Legacy Fund for a minimum of five years.

7. Economic dependence

Golf Saskatchewan currently receives revenue in grants from Saskatchewan Lotteries Trust Fund for Sport, Culture and Recreation. As a result, the Association is dependent upon the continuance of these grants to maintain operations at their current level.

8. Financial instruments

The Association recognized financial instruments consist of cash, accounts receivable, investments, accounts payable and accrued liabilities. The fair value of cash, accounts receivable, investments, accounts payable and accrued liabilities approximate their carrying value given the short-term nature of the amounts.

9. Financial risk management

The significant financial risks to which the Association is exposed are:

Credit risk

Credit risk is the risk that one party to a financial instrument will cause a financial loss for the other party by failing to discharge an obligation. The Association is exposed to credit risk on the accounts receivable from its customers, however, does not have a significant exposure to any individual customer or member. The Association incurred no bad debt expense in the current year. The Association's customers are mainly members of the Association.

Liquidity risk

Liquidity risk is the risk that an entity will encounter difficulty in meeting obligations associated with financial liabilities. The Association's exposure to liquidity risk is dependent on the receipt of funds from its operations and other related sources. Funds from these sources are primarily used to finance working capital and capital expenditure requirements and are considered adequate to meet the Association's financial obligations.

Price risk

Price risk is the risk that the fair value or future cash flows of a financial instrument will fluctuate because of changes in market prices. The Association's investments in publicly traded securities expose the Association to market price risk as such investments are subject to price changes in the open market. The Association does not use any derivative financial instruments to alter the effects of this risk.

10. Contributed materials

During the year, the Association received donated golf products estimated at a value of \$20,000 (2021 - \$20,000).

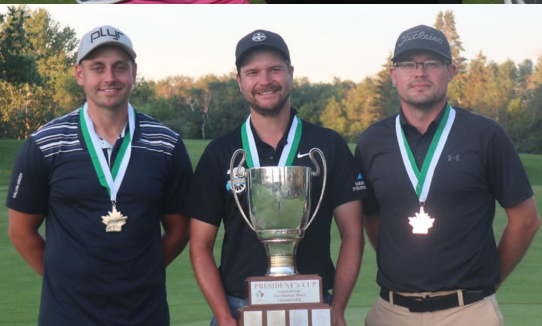
