The Elk Ridge Open returned with a field full of 156 PGA TOUR Canada professionals, as well as four Saskatchewan players including Josh Nagy, Chase Pochylko, Ty Campbell, and Will Blake. Congratulations to John Pak for winning the event. Pak separated himself from the field with a couple of birdies to start his back nine and went on to shoot 7-under 63 on Sunday, leaving him at 21-under 269, good for a fourshot victory at the Elk Ridge Saskatchewan Open presented by Brandt.

Golf Saskatchewan finished an exciting provincial season with the second playing of the Champions Cup which was won by Team Wascana Country Club for the second year in a row.



Golf Saskatchewan welcomed back the following courses into membership in 2023: Esterhazy GC, Last Oak GCC, and

Northern Meadows GC. Welcome to all the members at these clubs and we encourage our membership to schedule a trip and try these wonderful facilities in 2024 and beyond.

Golf Saskatchewan provided coaches (Anna Young/Jason Schneider) to assist the junior women and men's teams at their respective national championships. Golf Saskatchewan continues to work with inclusive groups promoting the sport including Special Olympics, Para-Golf Activities, supporting Blind Sports, including blind golfer.





# Membership Assistance Program (MAP Grants)

Funding through Sask Sport's Membership Assistance Program (MAP) enables Provincial Sport Organizations to allocate funds directly to their respective clubs, leagues or other affiliated members to increase the number of participants and the quality of sport development in Saskatchewan communities.

Club, league, and team inquiries on this grant program should be directed to their Provincial Sport Organization. In 2023, Golf Saskatchewan distributed \$100,300 in MAP Grants to 56 member clubs. A complete break-down of the clubs and the MAP funding from 2023 can be found in the Audited Financial Statements (Schedule 7) of the audited financial statements.

In 2024, \$102,900 will be distributed to Member Clubs. Since we began tracking the distributed MAP GRANTS funds in 2001, approximately \$1.85 million has been allotted to member clubs.

# **Golf Canada - Incident Protection Program**



In 2023, 20 Golf Saskatchewan members submit claims under the Incident Protection Program (IPP) valued at \$16,184 in damages, theft, or loss. The items included a combination of equipment damage, loss or theft, broken glass, golf cart damage or the program paying the deductible on a member's home insurance for items above the valued threshold. In 2024, we will continue to update our membership about the incident protection program.

- 2022 = 34 incidents | valued at \$30,615
- 2021 = 22 incidents | valued at \$15,166
- 2020 = 17 incidents | valued at 7,504
- 2019 = 20 incidents | valued at \$11,262

# **FINANCE COMMITTEE**

I am pleased to present the financial report for 2023 for the year ending Dec 31<sup>st</sup>, 2023. VIRTUS GROUP has completed the annual audit of the financial statements of Golf Saskatchewan. In VIRTUS Group's opinion, management maintains an appropriate system of internal accounting controls ensuring the transactions are accurately recorded on a timely basis, are properly approved and result in reliable financial statements. Management and the Board of Directors acknowledge the financial statements are their responsibility.

The Finance Committee, composed of members of the Board of Directors, meets with the management of Golf Saskatchewan to ensure accuracy of the association's financial reports. The Board of Directors has **voted to approve** the financial statements as presented in Appendix I of the annual report, March of 2024.



The financial highlights are shown below (compared to the approved audited financial statements of 2022):

- i. *Revenues* of \$1,100,193: an overall increase of approximately 13% or \$125,000.
  - *Championship Revenue:* increased approximately 19% or \$19,700.
- ii. *Expenses* of \$998,065: a decrease of approximately 3% or \$30,573.

The Expense Schedules shown below are detailed in the audited financial statements at the end of the report compared to the previous year (2022).

- iii. *Administration (Schedule 3)* decreased approximately 3% or \$11,191. (Operational expenses)
- iv. *Capacity and Interaction (Schedule 4)* decreased approximately 9% or \$3,195. (Awards, recognition, and meetings)
- v. *Participation and Interaction (Schedule 5)* decreased approximately 7% or \$10,518. (Championships)
- vi. *Excellence (Schedule 6)* decreased approximately 1% or \$859. (National championships, Coaching)
- vii. MAP GRANT (Schedule 7) flow through expenses from the LTF grant for membership programming.

The overall result is a <u>**\$102,128 surplus**</u>\* of revenues over expenses and therefore an increase in the reserves (unrestricted net assets).

# NOTES FOR MEMBERSHIP REGARDING THE GOLF SASKATCHEWAN BUDGETING PROCESS:

- 1. Board/management does not include grant revenues unless they have officially been announced/received.
- 2. For the 2023 Fiscal Year the Board of Directors (BOD) approved a strategic surplus budget of **\$471**.
  - a. Budget Forecasted Expenses = \$1,126,471 compared to Budget Revenues = \$1,126,942.
    - b. Actual Expenses = \$998,065 compared to Actual Revenues = \$1,100,193.
- 3. Reminder to membership:
  - a. If the BOD approves a deficit budget, it does not impact Golf Saskatchewan's overall financial position due to strong reserve funds.
- 4. Limited interest can be accounted in our general operating funds however the practice is not used.
- 5. In 2021, one of our strategic goals/measures was accomplished which was a \$0 (or better) annual budget in less than three years.

Thank you to the Golf Saskatchewan staff/management, Board of Directors, and the Finance Committee for their contributions during the past year.

# **COURSE RATING COMMITTEE**

# Member Club Course Ratings in 2023



# The Course Rating System consists of two basic elements:

**Course Rating** – the evaluation of the playing difficulty of a course for scratch golfers under normal course and weather conditions expressed as number of strokes (e.g. 72.5).

**Slope Rating** – the evaluation of the relative difficulty of a course for players who are not scratch golfers compared to the difficulty of the course for scratch golfers. The lowest Slope Rating is 55 and the highest 155. A course of standard playing difficulty will have a Slope Rating of 113.

Accuracy and consistency are the keys to effective course rating. Golf Canada and the provincial golf associations work together to rate golf courses and ensure that Course Ratings are accurate and uniform from coast to coast. Only Golf Canada authorized provincial golf associations may rate golf courses. If a club disagrees with its ratings, it may request that the provincial golf association review the ratings.

# 2023 Course Rating Seminar

The annual course rating seminar returned to an in-person format in 2023, held in Saskatoon May 16-18. The seminar was in-person for the Golf Saskatchewan volunteers, it was also available online for other participants. The seminar was attended by 19 Golf Saskatchewan volunteers and online by 4 volunteers from across the province and other jurisdictions. Following the seminar, the Saskatchewan volunteers conducted the Course Rating of the Riverside Country Club on May 18.

# 2024 Course Rating Seminar & Member Club Course Ratings

The 2024 seminar is tentatively scheduled for the week of May 13-17 in Saskatoon. The list of golf courses to be rated in 2024 has not been finalized as of the date of writing of the report but will be released after the AGM.



# WORLD HANDICAP SYSTEM (WHS) | RULES OF HANDICAPPING

# Purpose of the Golf Canada Handicap System

Handicapping is at the core of equitable competition in amateur golf, with few other sports enabling players to compete equitably across different skill levels the way that golf does. Golf Canada is the Authorized National body that is responsible for implementing and administering the Rules





of Handicapping in Canada in co-operation with the provincial golf associations.

The purpose of the World Handicap System (WHS) is to make the game of golf more enjoyable for golfers by providing a consistent means of measuring one's performance and progress and to enable golfers of differing abilities to compete, or play a casual round, with anyone else on a fair and equal basis. Through the WHS, each golfer establishes a "Handicap Index" which is the measure of a player's demonstrated ability on a course of standard playing difficulty.

The Handicap Index is calculated using the lowest 8 of the player's most recent 20 Score Differentials and updated with each new round played. The Handicap Index travels worldwide with the golfer from course to course (and tee to tee) and is used to calculate a "Course Handicap". The Course Handicap is the number of strokes a golfer receives from the specific set of tees at the course. The more difficult the golf course the more strokes the golfer receives and vice versa.

The relative difficulty of a golf course is determined jointly by Golf Canada and the provincial golf association using the WHS Course Rating System as administered by Golf Canada. Specially trained Course Rating Teams evaluate the difficulty of a golf course based on such variables as length and a number of obstacle factors (e.g. topography, bunkers, lateral & crossing obstacles, severity of rough, etc.).

Only Golf Canada member golf clubs are permitted to use the WHS and Course Rating System (as administered by Golf Canada) including related trademarks and service marks. Member golf clubs must do so in a manner that preserves the integrity and reliability of these systems. All rights to use these systems and related trademarks and service marks terminate should the golf club cease to be a member in good standing with Golf Canada.

# **Active Season and Posting of Scores**

The handicap season for posting scores at Saskatchewan golf courses is April 15 to Oct. 31. All games played outside the active handicap season in Saskatchewan should not be posted for your handicap. Where can you post your scores? Post your golf scores, on the web portal, course kiosk or the Golf Canada app. You can look up a golfers' handicap factor(s), find golf courses in Canada, compute your course handicap and more. Download the app in 2024.

# Handicap Seminars and Licensing Agreements

There are three ways a club/individual can certify under the WHS:

- 1. attend a seminar in person,
- 2. attend a webinar, or
- 3. register and take the online handicap seminar via the <u>Golf Canada</u> <u>website</u>.
- 4. For member clubs, please sign, and return the WHS Licensing Agreement to the Golf Saskatchewan office.

# **RULES OF GOLF COMMITTEE**

#### **Member Club Rules Clinics**

If you have a "What if " or "What happens when ..." a member club Rules of Golf clinic is for you. Four member clubs hosted a member club rules clinic in 2023. These sessions were held at golf courses for the benefit of members and are intended to familiarize golfers with frequently encountered rules situations and proper procedures.

In 2023, we did not hold an in person provincial Level 2 seminar. The 2024 Rules seminar will be held in April at the Royal Regina GC.

# Rules Education: Level 3, National Rules of Golf & T&RS



The Level 3 workshop was held virtually in early 2023. The series of Rules Sessions was provided to participants from coast to coast. The Level 3 online exam was challenged using the R&A Educational platform.

Golf Saskatchewan also hosted a Tournament & Referee School (TARS) at the Riverside Country Club in Saskatoon in May of 2023. A total of 9 people took part in the 3 full day sessions, from May 29-31.



#### Rules of Golf 2023 NEW Edition:

Effective January 2023: As the governing body of golf in Canada, Golf Canada holds the exclusive right to govern, publish and distribute the Rules of Golf in Canada. The Rules are typically updated every four years through the work of the R&A and the United States Golf Association. A joint committee of these associations, on which the Chair of Golf Canada's Rules and Amateur Status Committee sits, is charged with revising, modernizing, and improving the Rules of Golf.


#### **Amateur Status**

The Amateur Status Committee of Golf Canada defines an amateur as someone who plays the game as a non-remunerative and non-profit-making sport and who does not receive remuneration for teaching golf or for other activities because of golf skill or reputation.

Prizes in amateur events are limited to a retail value of \$1000. Yet players may receive expenses to play in competitions, accept golf scholarships and make inquiries as to the possibilities of becoming a professional, including playing in a qualifying event provided, if prize money is available, a waiver to any prize money is signed prior to playing.

The purpose and spirit of the rules is to keep the amateur game as free as possible from the abuses which may follow from uncontrolled sponsorship and financial incentive and to safeguard the rules of play and handicapping so that golf can be fully enjoyed by all amateur golfers.


# Building Game Changers, with First Tee – Prairies



In January 2023, Golf Canada launched the First Tee – Prairies chapter. Replacing and enhancing Future Links, First Tee is a youth development program providing youth of equity deserving communities, with life enhancing experiences through golf. The program offers accessible and inclusive programming at golf courses, schools, and community centres, with the goal of growing the game in Canada and having it reflect the diversity of our country.

In their first year, First Tee – Prairies partnered with Lakeview Par 3 Golf Course in Regina and Wildwood Golf Course in Saskatoon as the first program locations in Saskatchewan. Wildwood held a successful 4-week program, with Coach Jason Schneider hosting a full roster of beginner golfers. The participants were introduced to the fundamentals of golf and its inherent values, in the form of character-building lessons. They are excited to see the program at Lakeview Par 3 Golf Course grow as they are aiming to host programming from Spring to Fall, in 2024.

First Tee - Prairies has built relationships with ethnocultural organizations and connected with newcomer groups. Early on, the chapter established a relationship with the Truly Alive Youth and Family Foundation of Saskatoon. TAYFFI is a Black-led organization that provides programming and support services to families of visible minorities and vulnerable communities. With the help of TAYFFI's dedicated volunteers, their programming was the driving force for First Tee in Saskatoon this past year. Additionally, First Tee - Prairies partnered with the YMCA of Saskatoon and Regina, both of which will be beginning their programming in Spring 2024.



#### **2024 Growth Projection**

In 2024, First Tee - Prairies will be looking to bring the program to three new golf courses in Saskatchewan. Each program location will also connect with schools and community groups within close proximity to the golf course. This will introduce students and participants to the sport in a welcoming environment, that will then transition onto the course.

The team is dedicated to building relationships with community organizations, stakeholders, and volunteers to provide support for equity-deserving groups including BIPOC communities, girls, newcomers, and individuals with disabilities. Working alongside Indigenous groups in Saskatchewan is of the upmost importance for First Tee and they will be looking to establish Indigenous led programming in 2024. This year they will also begin hosting all-female programming and events, in collaboration with groups such as Girls in the Game and Truly Alive Youth and Family Foundation.

# **Get Involved**

Want to make a difference in the lives of young people? There are many ways you can support the mission of First Tee – Prairies and help us introduce the game of golf and its inherent values like honesty, respect, and confidence, to kids and teens.





**Schools and Community Centres:** The First Tee School and Community Program aims to bring First Tee curriculum to children's physical education classes and after school programming. First Tee provides educators with all the tools and resources necessary to teach youth leadership skills, through golf. This includes custom developmentally appropriate equipment and a full curriculum.

**Participants:** First Tee sessions are delivered in a welcoming group setting for youth 6-12 years of age, regardless of background or previous golf experience. On the course, the game of golf is seamlessly integrated with character building lessons, to help kids uncover their inner strength, self-confidence, and resilience that they can carry into their everyday life.

**Coaches and Volunteers:** First Tee - Prairies relies heavily on volunteers and coaches to accomplish their mission. There is always a need for passionate individuals to fill several positions such as coaches, event volunteers, and traveling program support. All experience levels are welcome, as training is provided to ensure children have a safe and empowering environment to play in. Led by the PGA of Canada, First Tee Coach Education is delivered to aspiring coaches who are passionate about the development of junior golf and enables coaches to choose their own level of involvement.

**Donations and Sponsorship:** First Tee – Prairies is fully funded through charitable contributions from donor aligning with the program's mission to positively impact the lives of youth through golf. Whether it be a monthly donation, corporate partnership, third party fundraiser, or one time donation, it contributes to our ability to eliminate financial barriers for deserving youth in Saskatchewan.

# Junior-Junior Championship



The goal of the event is to introduce kids to competitive golf, providing a fun, learning experience for golfers under the age of thirteen and introduce players of that age to multi-day events. There were **11** *participants* in this fun, Stableford format tournament with a parent/guardian/or adult, acting as the caddy to assist the pace of play and overall enjoyment.

The JR-JR will be an annual event alongside the junior provincial championships moving forward and will be at the Deer Park Municipal Golf Course in 2024.

# Junior Skills Challenge (JSC)





JSC was not on the calendar of events for Golf Saskatchewan in 2023 but is back on the calendar for 2024. Please watch the website and social media communications for details and locations.

The Junior Skills Challenge is an online and interactive program that focuses on developing the key golf skills of putting, chipping and driving. The online leaderboard allows instructors to upload players' scores so they can track their improvement. Using the data, players are ranked nationally by age group, and scores on the National Leaderboard. Top competitors nationally are invited to compete in the annual JSC National Final.

# National Athlete Assistance Subsidy (NAAS)



Since 1999, (when the CLGA of Saskatchewan and SGA amalgamated into one association), Golf Saskatchewan has provided more than <u>\$1 million dollars</u> (\$1,165,387) in combined Athlete Assistance and funding towards national championships. The Sport Development Committee believes in our athletes competing and excelling at the highest levels.

So how does a player qualify for NAAS?  $\rightarrow$  Play in our championships and commit to playing at nationals. Following our provincial championships, athletes who qualify to attend nationals, either on teams or quota spots, are eligible to receive funding. The amount of subsidy is determined on an annual basis, however more dollars are allocated towards players who make the team spots (those who medal). The remainder of the funds are shared with the remaining quota spot players.

# **SAGE Scholarships & High School Bursaries**

The program annually presents scholarships to assist deserving member golfers in their pursuit of high school and post-secondary academic excellence. The successful recipients are selected based on academic excellence as well as some weighting of their golf participation. The two organizations who pay the scholarship amounts are Golf Saskatchewan and the Saskatoon Community Foundation.

# **Coaching Development**

The PGA of Canada's coaching program is developed in partnership with Golf Canada and the Coaching Association of Canada (CAC). The PGA of Canada is one of 67 sports participating in the National Coaching Certification Program (NCCP). It is the recognized national standard for coach training and certification in Canada. Each year more than 50,000 coaches take an NCCP course, and more than 1 million coaches have participated in the program, making it one of Canada's largest adult education programs. In 2023, Clinton Schmaltz completed the requirements of the CNC program. As of 2023 Saskatchewan has:

# **Tony Cote Saskatchewan Games**

The Tony Cote Summer/Winter Games formerly known as the Saskatchewan First Nation Summer/Winter Games was initiated in 1974 by Chief Tony Cote and the Council of the Cote First Nation and their membership. They determined that most First Nation youth under the age of 20 were excluded by mainstream sport systems.

The inception of the Summer Games was to coincide with the celebration of the 100th Anniversary of the signing of Treaty 4. The <u>2024 Games</u> are being hosted by the Lac La Ronge Indian Band (LLRIB) based out of La Ronge.

The golf event will be played at Eagle Point Resort and the games are slated for August 3 – 10, 2024.



# North American Indigenous Games (NAIG)



The 2023 North American Indigenous Games (NAIG) were very successful for Saskatchewan golfers!

Three players returned to Saskatchewan with medals intact including Cassidy Strongarm, Hailey Thunderchild, and Solomon Ness. They all earned medals at the event hosted at The Links at Brunello just outside of Halifax, NS.

# Saskatchewan Summer Games



In the summer of 2024, more than 1,800 athletes, coaches and officials will gather in the Border City to share in the thrill of competition and camaraderie on the provincial stage. Upwards of 1,000 community volunteers will be recruited to help welcome thousands of visitors to Lloydminster during the seven days of Games competition.

The Saskatchewan Games Council looks forward to partnering with the City of Lloydminster and the 2024 Saskatchewan Summer Games Host Society to stage an incredible celebration of sport,

volunteerism, and community.

Six Saskatchewan athletes, three of each gender under the age of 17 as of the final day of the 2024 Golf Canada Junior Girls and Junior Boys Championships (Female athletes: July 25, 2024; Male athletes: August 16, 2024) are eligible.

Details about the 2024 qualifiers will be announced prior to the official start of the active golf season on April 15.

Solo-Rider adaptive golf carts are turning what used to be thought of as an impossibility into a reality. Athletes who have a mobility issue can now enjoy the stable, comfortable, and fun way to get back in the game. The specialty cart enables golfers to continue to enjoy the game of golf or take it up for the first time.



Golf Saskatchewan, through funding from Sask Sport Inc. and a Para-Sport grant, now owns three Solo-ider powercarts. The Solo-Riders are housed at the Silverwood Golf Course and Holiday Park Golf Course, the third cart is under maintenance and will be available in 2024 to an inquiring club.

# NATIONAL GOLF LEAGUE (NGL)

#### **NGL Championship**

The National Golf League (NGL) made its debut in 2023, attracting nearly 60 clubs nationwide during our pilot year. Among them, six Saskatchewan clubs participated in our inaugural season. To learn more about the National Golf League, visit our website at <u>www.nationalgolfleague.ca/</u>.

Integrating seamlessly with existing league structures, the NGL adopts a 9-hole net Stableford format, ensuring fairness through the inclusion of handicaps. Golf Genius serves as our designated platform for tracking provincial and national leaderboards. League Administrators have the flexibility to designate six "Major Weeks," during which four out of six scores contribute to qualification for provincial finals.



The 2023 Saskatchewan Regional Finals held at Royal Regina Golf Club on September 26<sup>th</sup>, we extend a warm invitation to the six golf courses who participated in the regular season of the National Golf League. The event witnessed a great day of golf, with three Saskatchewan teams qualifying for the NGL National Championship, under extremely windy conditions.

These teams will have the exclusive opportunity to compete on the host course of the 2025 RBC Canadian Open in Hamilton, just days before our national Open in Hamilton. Here's a high-level overview of the NGL:

- The National Golf League seamlessly integrates into your existing league structure.
- Using a 9-hole net Stableford format, incorporating handicaps for fairness across leagues.
- Golf Genius facilitates tracking of provincial and national leaderboards.
- Teams select six "Major weeks," with four scores counting towards qualification for provincial finals.
- Top individuals in the league can invite a partner from within the league to the Regional (Provincial) Finals.
- Participant ratios for regional qualification are set at 20:1 for women, 25:1 for mixed, and 30:1 for men's leagues.
- In 2024, each league is requested to donate \$25 per player to the First Tee program, with proceeds staying within the province.

#### Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

As part of an audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.

  the audit evidence obtained, whether a material uncertainty exists related to events or conditions that may cast
  significant doubt on the Association's ability to continue as a going concern. If we conclude that a material
  uncertainty exists, we are required to draw attention in our auditor's report to the related disclosures in the financial
  statements or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion. Our conclusions are based on the audit
  evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the
  Association to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial statements, including the disclosures, and whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

We communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.

## 1. Nature of operations

Saskatchewan Golf Association Inc. ("Golf Saskatchewan" or the "Association") is continued under *The Non-Profit Corporations Act, 2022,* in the province of Saskatchewan. The Association promotes and coordinates amateur golf in the province of Saskatchewan. The Association is exempt from income tax under Section 149(1)(I) of *The Income Tax Act.* 

## 2. Summary of significant accounting policies

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations. The financial statements required management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amount of revenues and expenses during the period. These estimates are reviewed periodically, and, as adjustments become necessary, they are reported in earnings in the period in which they become known. The financial statements reflect the following accounting policies:

## Financial instruments - recognition and measurement

Financial assets and financial liabilities are recorded on the statement of financial position when the Association becomes party to the contractual provisions of the financial instrument. All financial instruments are required to be recognized at fair value upon initial recognition, except for certain related party transactions. Measurement in subsequent periods of equity instruments is at fair value. All other financial instruments are subsequently measured at amortized cost adjusted by transaction costs, which are amortized over the expected life of the instrument.

Fair value is the amount at which a financial instrument could be exchanged at arm's length between willing, unrelated parties in an open market. Changes in fair value of financial instruments measured at fair value are recognized in the excess of revenues over expenses.

When there is an indication of impairment and such impairment is determined to have occurred, the carrying amount of financial assets measured at amortized cost is reduced to the greater of the discounted cash flows expected or the proceeds that could be realized from sale of the financial asset. Such impairments can be subsequently reversed if the value subsequently improves.

The Association's recognized financial instruments consist of cash, investments, accounts receivable, accounts payable and accrued liabilities. The fair value of the items approximate cost given their short term nature or recognition at market value.

### Inventory

Inventory is recorded at the lower of cost and net realizable value. Cost is determined based on the specific identification method.

## Tangible capital assets

Tangible capital assets are recorded at cost less accumulated amortization. Amortization is provided on a declining balance basis over the estimated useful life of the assets at the following annual rates.

## 2. Summary of significant accounting policies (continued)

## Funds

The Golf Hall of Fame fund is internally restricted fund established to hold funds raised in support of a Saskatchewan golf hall of fame.

## Revenue recognition

The Association follows the deferral method for accounting for contributions. Restricted contributions are recognized as revenue in the year in which related expenses are incurred. Unrestricted contributions are recognized as revenue when received or receivable, if the amount can be reasonably estimated and collections are assured. Revenues received from the Saskatchewan Lotteries Trust Fund for Sport, Culture and Recreation are recorded as revenue in year to which the funding relates. Membership fees are recognized in the membership year, which coincides with the Association's fiscal year. Revenues from tournaments, and clinics are recognized when the event occurs. Investment revenue is recognized as it is earned. Fundraising and donation revenues are recognized when they are received.

### Donations in kind

Donations of material and services are recorded at fair market value when received if the amount can be reasonably estimated and would otherwise have been purchased.

### Contributed services

The work of Golf Saskatchewan is dependent on the services of many volunteers at amateur events as well as for the governance council and various committees. Since these services are not normally purchased and because of the difficulty in determining their fair value, donated services are not recorded in the statement of operations.

## 4. Investments continued

The Association holds three guaranteed investment certificates totaling \$75,000, each with a stated interest rate of 5% maturing January 2024 and three prime linked cashable guaranteed investment certificates totaling \$75,000, each with a maturity date of August 2024.

The RBC A+ Unified Managed Account is a structure which provides access to multiple investment managers within one account. The asset allocation of the account at year end was 51% equities and 47% fixed income (2022 – 49% equities and 48% fixed income), with an emphasis on high quality securities, income generation, downside protection and capital preservation.

At December 31, 2023, the asset allocation in the account was \$7,761 in cash, \$244,561 in fixed income and \$264,723 in equities. At December 31, 2022, the asset allocation in the account was \$12,675 in cash, \$230,714 in fixed income and \$241,959 in equities.

## 5. Sport Legacy Fund

The cash surrender value of the life insurance policy and investment in the Sport Legacy Fund consists of donations based on various programs and contributions by Sask Sport. These amount are recorded as deferred revenue until amount have been received. To qualify for an additional contribution by Sask Sport Inc., the Association is required to leave the original amount and any additional donations in the Legacy Fund for a minimum of five years.

### 8. Economic dependence

Golf Saskatchewan currently receives revenue in grants from Saskatchewan Lotteries Fund for Sport, Culture and Recreation. As a result, the Association is dependent upon the continuance of these grants to maintain operations at their current level.

### 9. Financial risk management

The significant financial risks to which the Association is exposed are:

#### Credit risk

Credit risk is the risk that one party to a financial instrument will cause a financial loss for the other party by failing to discharge an obligation. The Association is exposed to credit risk on its accounts receivable. The Association did not incur bad debt expense in recent years.

#### Liquidity risk

Liquidity risk is the risk that an entity will encounter difficulty in meeting obligations associated with financial liabilities. The Association's exposure to liquidity risk is dependent on the receipt of funds from its operations and other related sources. Funds from these sources are primarily used to finance working capital and capital expenditure requirements and are considered adequate to meet the Association's financial obligations.

#### Price risk

Price risk is the risk that the fair value or future cash flows of a financial instrument will fluctuate because of changes in market prices. The Associations investments in publicly traded securities expose the Association to market price risk as such investments are subject to price changes in the open market. The Association does not use any derivative financial instruments to alter the effect of this risk.

## 10. Contributed materials

During the year, the Association received donated golf products estimated at a value of \$20,000 (2022 - \$20,000).
