


Welcome to the 2026 Annual General Meeting (AGM) of the Saskatchewan Golf Association Inc., operating as Golf Saskatchewan. It is wonderful to once again be joined by a broad and engaged audience. As we look ahead to the 2026 season, our organization would like to take this opportunity to celebrate the many accomplishments of the past year.

The Legends Golf Club in Warman proudly hosted the NEXTGEN Prairie Championship in 2025, welcoming 147 competitors. It was a fantastic event showcasing both high-level competition and the renowned hospitality of Saskatchewan golf community.

Golf Saskatchewan concluded an exciting provincial season with the fourth playing of the Champions Cup. Team Wascana Country Club claimed the title for the fourth consecutive year, narrowly edging out Royal Regina Golf Club in a closely contested finish.

In 2025, Golf Saskatchewan was pleased to welcome Frontier Golf Club, Lac Pelletier Golf Club, and the return to membership. Chitek Lake Golf Club and Jackfish Golf Club & Resort also rejoined Golf Saskatchewan. We extend a warm welcome to the members of these clubs and encourage our membership to



The items included a combination of equipment damage, loss or theft, broken glass, golf cart damage or the program paying the deductible on a member's home insurance for items above the valued threshold. In 2026, we will continue to update our membership about the incident protection program.

Membership Assistance Program (MAP Grants)



The purpose of the Membership Assistance Program (MAP) grant is to provide financial assistance to Golf Saskatchewan-registered affiliated clubs, enabling them to operate programs that encourage and promote community and club-level sport development within their local areas. The development of these programs and services helps strengthen clubs and supports growth in Golf Saskatchewan membership and participation.

The MAP program is funded by the Saskatchewan Lotteries Trust Fund for Sport, Culture & Recreation and is supported through the sale of lottery tickets in Saskatchewan.

In 2025, Golf Saskatchewan distributed **\$111,200** in MAP grants to **59 member clubs**. A complete breakdown of recipient clubs and MAP funding from 2025 can be found in **Schedule 7 of the Audited Financial Statements**.

In 2026, a total of **\$123,900** will be distributed to member clubs through the MAP program. Since tracking of MAP grant distributions began in 2001, approximately **\$2.06 million** has been allocated to member clubs across the province. Golf Saskatchewan thanks all stakeholders for their continued support in growing participation in the sport. Please remember purchasing lottery tickets directly supports programs such as MAP and the development of sport in Saskatchewan.

Ada Mackenzie Event

ADA MACKENZIE

Ada Mackenzie was one of the finest female golfers Canada ever produced. Her championship record includes the Canadian Ladies Open Championships, and the Canadian Ladies Club Championships. Mackenzie was inducted into the C.G. Women's Hall of Fame in 1927 and Hall of Fame in 1922. A true pioneer in women's golf, Mackenzie founded the Ladies Golf and Tennis Club of Toronto, the only golf club in Canada to have a clubhouse for women.

FINANCIAL REPORT FOR YEAR ENDING DEC-31-2025

I am pleased to present the financial report for 2025 for the year ending Dec. 31. VIRTUS GROUP has completed the annual audit of the financial statements of Golf Saskatchewan. In VIRTUS Group's opinion, management maintains an appropriate system of internal accounting controls ensuring the transactions are accurately recorded on a timely basis, are properly approved and result in reliable financial statements. Management and the Board of Directors acknowledge the financial statements are their responsibility.



The Finance Committee, composed of members of the Board of Directors, meets with the management of Golf Saskatchewan to ensure accuracy of the association's financial reports.

The Board of Directors has **voted to approve** the financial statements as presented in Appendix I of the annual report, March of 2026. NOTE: The **Revenue** and **Expense Schedules** shown below are detailed in our audited financial statements at the end of the report compared to the previous year (2025).

- i. **Revenues** of 1,150,789: an overall increase of approximately 3.65% or \$40,500.
 - o **Championship Revenue**: decreased approximately 2.85% or \$3,700.
- ii. **Expenses** of \$1,099,849: an increase of approximately 5% or \$51,000.
- iii. **Administration (Schedule 3)** increased approximately 1.7% or \$7,000 (Operational expenses)
- iv. **Capacity and Interaction (Schedule 4)** increased approximately 67% or \$17,500. (Awards, recognition, and meetings)
- v. **Participation and Interaction (Schedule 5)** decreased approximately 4% or \$6,900. (Championships and partnership grants with First Tee Prairies for Junior Initiatives)
- vi. **Excellence (Schedule 6)** increased approximately 36% or \$28,000. (National events, Coaching)
- vii. **MAP GRANT (Schedule 7)** flow through expenses from the Lotteries Trust Fund grant for membership programming – this is made possible through the purchase of lottery tickets in Saskatchewan.
- viii. **National Membership Dues**: decrease 0.1% and accounted for approximately \$257,500.

The overall result is an:

- ✦ **Operational Surplus** of **\$50,940**, plus and
- ✦ **Investment Portfolio Gain** totaling **\$60,383**, equaling
- ✦ An overall **\$111,323 surplus*** of revenues over expenses, and therefore an increase in the reserves (unrestricted net assets).

NOTES FOR MEMBERSHIP REGARDING THE GOLF SASKATCHEWAN BUDGETING PROCESS:

1. Board/management does not include grant revenues unless they have officially been announced/received.
2. For the 2025 Fiscal Year the Board of Directors (BOD) approved a strategic surplus budget of **\$590**.
 - a. Budget Revenues = \$1,173,174 compared to Budget Forecasted Expenses = \$1,172,712.
 - b. Actual Revenues = \$1,150,789 compared to Actual Expenses = \$1,099,848.
3. For 2025, the investment value has not been included in the operational area.
 - a. Investment gain in 2025 was \$60,789 compared to \$60,383 in 2024.

The Course Rating System consists of two basic elements:

Course Rating – the evaluation of the playing difficulty of a course for scratch golfers under normal course and weather conditions expressed as number of strokes (e.g. 72.5).

Slope Rating – the evaluation of the relative difficulty of a course for players who are not scratch golfers compared to the difficulty of the course for scratch golfers. The lowest Slope Rating is 55 and the highest 155. A course of standard playing difficulty will have a Slope Rating of 113.

Accuracy and consistency are the keys to effective course rating. Golf Canada and the provincial golf associations work together to rate golf courses and ensure that Course Ratings are accurate and uniform from coast to coast. Only Golf Canada authorized provincial golf associations may rate golf courses. If a club disagrees with its ratings, it may request that the provincial golf association review the ratings.

2025 Course Rating Seminar

The annual in person course rating seminar was held in Saskatoon May 14-15. The seminar was attended by 17 volunteers. Following the seminar, the Saskatchewan volunteers conducted the Course Rating of the Valleyview Delisle Golf & Country Club.

2026 Course Rating Seminar & Member Club Course Ratings

The 2026 seminar is tentatively scheduled for the week of May 6 and 7* in Saskatoon. The list of golf courses to be rated in 2026 has not been finalized as of the date of writing of the report but will be released after the AGM.

WORLD HANDICAP SYSTEM (WHS) | RULES OF HANDICAPPING

Purpose of the Golf Canada Handicap System



Handicapping is at the core of equitable competition in amateur golf, with few other sports enabling players to compete equitably across different skill levels the way that golf does. Golf Canada is the Authorized National body that is responsible for implementing and administering the Rules of Handicapping in Canada in co-operation with the provincial golf associations.

The purpose of the World Handicap System (WHS) is to make the game of golf more enjoyable for golfers by providing a consistent means of measuring one's performance and progress and to enable golfers of differing abilities to compete, or play a casual round, with anyone else on a fair and equal basis. Through the WHS, each golfer establishes a "Handicap Index" which is the measure of a player's demonstrated ability on a course of standard playing difficulty.

The Handicap Index is calculated using the lowest 8 of the player's most recent 20 Score Differentials and updated with each new round played. The Handicap Index travels worldwide with the golfer from course to course (and tee to tee) and is used to calculate a "Course Handicap". The Course Handicap is the number of strokes a golfer receives from the specific set of tees at the course. The more difficult the golf course is the more strokes the golfer receives and vice versa.

The relative difficulty of a golf course is determined jointly by Golf Canada and the provincial golf association using the WHS Course Rating System as administered by Golf Canada. Specially trained Course Rating Teams evaluate the difficulty of a golf course based on such variables as length and a number of obstacle factors (e.g. topography, bunkers, lateral & crossing obstacles, severity of rough, etc.).

Only Golf Canada member golf clubs are permitted to use the WHS and Course Rating System (as administered by Golf Canada) including related trademarks and service marks. Member golf clubs must do so in a manner that preserves the integrity and reliability of these systems. All rights to use these systems and related trademarks and service marks terminate should the golf club cease to be a member in good standing with Golf Canada.

Active Season and Posting of Scores

The handicap season for posting scores at Saskatchewan golf courses is April 15 to Oct. 31. All games played outside the active handicap season in Saskatchewan should not be posted for your handicap. Where can you post your scores? Post your golf scores, on the web portal, course kiosk or the Golf Canada app. You can look up a golfer's handicap factor(s), find golf courses in Canada, compute your course handicap and more. If you don't have the app, download it in 2026.

Handicap Seminars and Licensing Agreements

There are three ways a club/individual can certify under the WHS:

1. attend a seminar in person,
2. attend a webinar, or
3. register and take WHS handicap seminar at [Golf Canada website](#).

The Level 3 certified people will also be working at the Wascana CC when they host the 2026 Canadian Junior Boys national championship in August.

First Tee - Prairies

Building Game Changers, with First Tee – Prairies

2025 has been a year of growth for the First Tee – Prairies program in Saskatchewan. The chapter welcomed new community groups and schools to the pre-established Wildwood Golf Course hub in Saskatoon and Lakeview Par 3 Golf Course hub in Regina, as well as several coaches and volunteers to assist with the delivery of the program. In total, the First Tee Prairies had a total of **1,980 participants**.

Coach **Jason Schneider** returned to lead new and returning participants through a 4-week spring and fall program at Wildwood Golf Course. Lakeview Par 3 Golf Course held its first season of programming, with local schoolteacher and passionate community member, **Jason Muller**, leading the program. The season began with Coach Muller hosting community partner, Girls in the Game, for a Try Golf clinic to conclude their 8 week in-house First Tee program. Similarly, Coach Muller hosted a 4-week program in the months of July and August, for a full roster of beginner golfers from the community.

Try Golf events were held at three locations in 2025.

- ✦ Alvin Buckwold School Field Trip at the NextGen Prairies Championship in Warman, attracting 26 participants.
- ✦ All Girls Try Clinic at the NextGen Prairies Championship, attracting 6 participants, and
- ✦ All Girls Try Golf Clinic at the Wildwood Golf Course, attracting 6 participants.

2026 Growth Projection

In 2026, First Tee - Prairies will be looking to bring the program to three new golf courses in Saskatchewan. Each program location will also connect schools and community groups within close proximity to the golf course. This will introduce students and participants to the sport in a welcoming environment, that will then transition onto the course. In addition to the previous golf location (Wildwood GC and Lakeview GC), Hillcrest Golf Course in Moose Jaw, Elmwood Golf and Country Club and Riverside Country Club will be offering programming in 2026.

The team is dedicated to building relationships with community organizations, stakeholders, and volunteers to provide support for equity-deserving groups including BIPOC communities, girls, newcomers, and individuals with disabilities.

2026 goals will be to further promote the current/newly added program locations, offering more programs throughout the season and connecting with our community partners to get youth into programs and onto the links. The dates and locations of sessions will be announce in the spring of 2026, partnering with the Truly Alive Youth and Family Foundation and the YMCA Saskatoon.

How To Get Involved



Schools and Community Centres: The First Tee School and Community Program aims to bring First Tee curriculum to children’s physical education classes and after school programming. First Tee provides educators with all the tools and resources necessary to teach youth leadership skills, through golf. This includes custom developmentally appropriate equipment and a full curriculum.

Participants: First Tee sessions are delivered in a welcoming group setting for youth 6-12 years of age, regardless of background or previous golf experience. On the course, the game of golf is seamlessly integrated with character building lessons, to help kids uncover their inner strength, self-confidence, and resilience that they can carry into their everyday life.

Coaches and Volunteers: First Tee - Prairies relies heavily on volunteers and coaches to accomplish their mission. There is always a need for passionate individuals to fill several positions such as coaches, event volunteers, and traveling program support. All experience levels are welcome, as training is provided to ensure children have a safe and empowering environment to play in. Led by the PGA of Canada, First Tee Coach Education is delivered to aspiring coaches who are passionate about the development of junior golf and enables coaches to choose their own level of involvement. 2026 Community Coach training will be held at the Wascana Country Club on May 2nd and 3rd, led by Bri-Ann Tokariwski.

Donations and Sponsorship: First Tee – Prairies is fully funded through charitable contributions from donor aligning with the program’s mission to positively impact the lives of youth through golf. Whether it be a monthly donation, corporate partnership, third party fundraiser, or one time donation, it contributes to our ability to eliminate financial barriers for deserving youth in Saskatchewan.

YOUTH ON COURSE (YOC) | 100 HOLE HIKE IN SUPPORT OF YOUTH ON COURSE

youth on course 100 HOLE HIKE

Youth on Course is a program providing young people with access to life-changing opportunities through golf. It offers members the chance to play rounds for \$5 or less at thousands of golf courses in the U.S., Canada, and Australia. The program aims to break down financial barriers and bring diversity to the world of golf, allowing kids aged 6 to 18 to play for less than \$5. With nearly 5 million rounds facilitated, Youth on Course promotes confidence, community, and academic improvement among young golfers.



On August 28, Silverwood Golf Course's par-3 course in northeast Saskatoon opened its front nine holes for the day to host the **Prairies 100 Hole Hike**. Participants completed 100 holes by playing 11 full rounds plus one additional hole. Conditions were ideal, with minimal wind and temperatures reaching 30 degrees, making for an exceptional day on the course. Participants logged approximately 29,000 steps while enjoying the game alongside colleagues and friends.

The Prairies 100 Hole Hike raised more than \$15,000 in support of Youth On Course golf initiatives. Golf Canada's National Manager of Youth on Course and Events, Nathalie Mihalek, expressed appreciation for the participants' efforts:

"Thanks to Silverwood Golf Course, our hikers were able to play 100 holes on foot in one day and rally their networks to raise crucial funds to make golf more affordable and accessible. These funds will give more youth the opportunity to experience the game we love and its life-changing benefits."

Valleyview Golf Club in Delisle, Deer Valley Golf Club north of Regina, and Harbor Golf and RV Park in Elbow are the three participating golf courses offering the program.

EXCELLENCE – IN THE GAME

National Athlete Assistance Subsidy (NAAS)

Since 1999, (when the CLGA of Saskatchewan and SGA amalgamated into one association), Golf Saskatchewan has provided more than **\$1.25 million dollars (\$1,262,429)** in combined Athlete Assistance and funding towards national championships. The Sport Development Committee believes in our athletes competing and excelling at the highest levels.



So how does a player qualify for NAAS?

Athletes are encouraged to compete in Golf Saskatchewan’s provincial championships and commit to participating at the national level if they qualify. Following the provincial championships, athletes who earn qualification to Nationals—either through team selection or individual quota spots—are eligible to receive financial support. Funding amounts are determined annually, with a greater proportion allocated to athletes who secure team positions through medal performances. Remaining funds are distributed among athletes qualifying through individual quota spots.

Scholarships & High School Bursaries | SAGE

The program annually presents scholarships to assist deserving Golf Saskatchewan member golfers in their pursuit of high school and post-secondary academic excellence. The successful recipients are selected based on academic excellence as well as some weighting of their golf participation. The two organizations who pay the scholarship amounts are Golf Saskatchewan and the Saskatoon Community Foundation.

Coaching Development

The PGA of Canada’s coaching program is developed in partnership with Golf Canada and the Coaching Association of Canada (CAC). The PGA of Canada is one of 67 sports participating in the National Coaching Certification Program (NCCP). It is the recognized national standard for coach training and certification in Canada. Each year more than 50,000 coaches take an NCCP course, and more than 1 million coaches have participated in the program, making it one of Canada’s largest adult education programs. EASTER GOLF CAMP



April 19–24, 2025 Comox, British Columbia, the 2025 Easter Golf Camp was an outstanding success, providing eight junior golfers with four full days of elite-level instruction in the beautiful setting of Comox, British Columbia. From the moment the camp began, it was clear that the experience exceeded expectations. The participants consistently demonstrated enthusiasm and enjoyment, both on and off the course, making it difficult to find a moment when the group was not fully engaged and having fun with their peers.

Course conditions throughout the week were above average, contributing significantly to the overall quality of the camp. The group had full access to the driving range and short-game practice areas, allowing for a structured and effective daily schedule. Mornings were dedicated primarily to swing training, followed by focused work on chipping, putting, and bunker play leading up to the approximately 1:00 p.m. tee times. Each participant was encouraged to concentrate on specific areas of their game that required improvement, demonstrating a high level of commitment and self-motivation despite the short duration of the camp.

Afternoons consisted of friendly yet competitive 18-hole rounds, providing an opportunity for the players to apply the skills and techniques learned earlier in the day to real on-course situations. The coaches rotated throughout each round to ensure consistent interaction with every participant. This approach allowed players to ask questions, hit additional shots when necessary, and gain a clearer understanding of how to adjust their play in future situations. The positive impact of this on-course instruction was evident in the steady improvement shown by the players each day.



The competitive spirit among the participants was a defining highlight of the camp. Friendly rivalry and “bragging rights” played a major role, extending beyond the course and continuing during evening meals. This atmosphere fostered motivation and encouraged players to push themselves further each day, contributing to both skill development and team bonding.

Feedback from the participants was overwhelmingly positive. Every player expressed a strong interest in returning for the camp in future years. Additionally, feedback was received from players who attended alternative trips during the same period, noting they would choose this camp in the future. The overall experience including food, accommodation, and golf facilities was consistently praised and helped establish the camp as a highly desirable development opportunity.

The 2025 Easter Golf Camp was a resounding success. The experience created lasting memories and meaningful development opportunities for all participants. The overwhelmingly positive feedback ensures strong future participation and supports the camp’s potential to grow into a consistent annual event. With continued partnership at Crown Isle Golf Resort and favorable weather conditions, this camp is well positioned to remain a premier junior golf development opportunity for years to come.

Canada Summer Games



The Canada Summer Games are important because they are Canada's largest multi-sport event for youth, a major driver of athlete development, a catalyst for community legacy projects, and a powerful source of national unity and economic impact. They help provinces like Saskatchewan showcase emerging talent while strengthening sport infrastructure and community pride.

The Canada Summer Games took place in St. John's, Newfoundland, with golf hosted at Bally Haly Golf and Country Club from August 19 to 22. Saskatchewan fielded a strong team featuring provincial under-19 and under-17 women's champion **Grace Odnokon**, along with **Tayla Perry**, **Ryan Mosher**, and **Ethan Hunter**.


A standout moment came when **Ethan Hunter captured the bronze medal**, finishing third in the men's competition. This marked **Saskatchewan's first golf medal at the Canada Summer Games since the sport was introduced in 2009**, making it a milestone achievement for the province.



The National Golf League (NGL) made its debut in 2023, attracting nearly 60 clubs nationwide during our pilot year. In 2025, two dozen teams of two competed in the final of the BDO National Golf League with two teams earning the right to represent Saskatchewan in Ontario. To learn more about the National Golf League, visit our website at www.nationalgolfleague.ca/.

Integrating seamlessly with existing league structures, the NGL adopts a 9-hole net Stableford format, ensuring fairness through the inclusion of handicaps. Golf Genius serves as our designated platform for tracking provincial and national leaderboards. League Administrators have the flexibility to designate six "Major Weeks," during which four out of six scores contribute to qualification for provincial finals.



The [2025 Saskatchewan Regional Finals](#) were held at the Royal Regina Golf Club on Sept. 18 with four golfers earning their way to the national event. These teams will have the exclusive opportunity to compete on the host course of the 2026 RBC Canadian Open at TPC Toronto, just days before our national Open at Osprey Valley. Here's a high-level overview of the NGL:

- The National Golf League seamlessly integrates into your existing league structure.
- Using a 9-hole net Stableford format, incorporating handicaps for fairness across leagues.
- Golf Genius facilitates tracking of provincial and national leaderboards.
- Teams select six "Major weeks," with four scores counting towards qualification for provincial finals.
- Top individuals in the league can invite a partner from within the league to the Regional (Provincial) Finals.
- Participant ratios for regional qualification are set at 20:1 for women, 25:1 for mixed, and 30:1 for men's leagues.
- In 2025, each league is requested to donate \$25 per player to the First Tee program, with proceeds staying within the province.





1. Nature of operations

Saskatchewan Golf Association Inc. ("Golf Saskatchewan" or the "Association") is continued under *The Non-Profit Corporations Act, 2022*, in the province of Saskatchewan. The Association promotes and coordinates amateur golf in the province of Saskatchewan. The Association is exempt from income tax under Section 149(1)(l) of *The Income Tax Act*.

2. Summary of significant accounting policies

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations. The financial statements required management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amount of revenues and expenses during the period. These estimates are reviewed periodically, and, as adjustments become necessary, they are reported in earnings in the period in which they become known. The financial statements reflect the following accounting policies:

Financial instruments - recognition and measurement

Financial assets and financial liabilities are recorded on the statement of financial position when the Association becomes party to the contractual provisions of the financial instrument. All financial instruments are required to be recognized at fair value upon initial recognition, except for certain related party transactions. Measurement in subsequent periods of equity instruments is at fair value. All other financial instruments are subsequently measured at amortized cost adjusted by transaction costs, which are amortized over the expected life of the instrument.

Fair value is the amount at which a financial instrument could be exchanged at arm's length between willing, unrelated parties in an open market. Changes in fair value of financial instruments measured at fair value are recognized in the excess of revenues over expenses.

When there is an indication of impairment and such impairment is determined to have occurred, the carrying amount of financial assets measured at amortized cost is reduced to the greater of the discounted cash flows expected or the proceeds that could be realized from sale of the financial asset. Such impairments can be subsequently reversed if the value subsequently improves.

The Association's recognized financial instruments consist of cash, investments, accounts receivable, accounts payable and accrued liabilities. The fair value of the items approximate cost given their short term nature or recognition at market value.

Inventory

Inventory is recorded at the lower of cost and net realizable value. Cost is determined based on the specific identification method.

Tangible capital assets

Tangible capital assets are recorded at cost less accumulated amortization. Amortization is provided on a declining balance basis over the estimated useful life of the assets at the following annual rates.

2. Summary of significant accounting policies (continued)

Funds

The Golf Hall of Fame fund is internally restricted fund established to hold funds raised in support of a Saskatchewan golf hall of fame.

Revenue recognition

The Association follows the deferral method for accounting for contributions. Restricted contributions are recognized as revenue in the year in which related expenses are incurred. Unrestricted contributions are recognized as revenue when received or receivable, if the amount can be reasonably estimated and collections are assured. Revenues received from the Saskatchewan Lotteries Trust Fund for Sport, Culture and Recreation are recorded as revenue in year to which the year to which the funding relates. Membership fees are recognized in the membership year, which coincides with the Association's fiscal year. Revenues from tournaments, and clinics are recognized when the event occurs. Investment revenue is recognized as it is earned. Fundraising and donation revenues are recognized when they are received.

Donations in kind

Donations of material and services are recorded at fair market value when received if the amount can be reasonably estimated and would otherwise have been purchased.

Contributed services

The work of Golf Saskatchewan is dependent on the services of many volunteers at amateur events as well as for the governance council and various committees. Since these services are not normally purchased and because of the difficulty in determining their fair value, donated services are not recorded in the statement of operations.

4. Investments continued

The RBC A+ Unified Managed Account is a structure which provides access to multiple investment managers within one account. The asset allocation of the account at year end was 49% equities and 48% fixed income (2024 – 48% equities and 49% fixed income), with an emphasis on high quality securities, income generation, downside protection and capital preservation.

At December 31, 2025, the asset allocation in the account was \$18,500 in cash, \$299,751 in fixed income and \$308,013 in equities. At December 31, 2024, the asset allocation in the account was \$19,405 in cash, \$277,797 in fixed income and \$271,468 in equities.

5. Sport Legacy Fund

The cash surrender value of the life insurance policy and investment in the Sport Legacy Fund consists of donations based on various programs and contributions by Sask Sport. These amount are recorded as deferred revenue until amounts have been received. To qualify for an additional contribution by Sask Sport Inc., the Association is required to leave the original amount and any additional donations in the Legacy Fund for a minimum of five years.

8. Economic dependence

Golf Saskatchewan currently receives revenue in grants from Saskatchewan Lotteries Fund for Sport, Culture and Recreation. As a result, the Association is dependent upon the continuance of these grants to maintain operations at their current level.

9. Financial risk management

The significant financial risks to which the Association is exposed are:

Credit risk

Credit risk is the risk that one party to a financial instrument will cause a financial loss for the other party by failing to discharge an obligation. The Association is exposed to credit risk on its accounts receivable. The Association did not incur bad debt expense in recent years.

Price risk

Price risk is the risk that the fair value or future cash flows of a financial instrument will fluctuate because of changes in market prices. The Associations investments in publicly traded securities expose the Association to market price risk as such investments are subject to price changes in the open market. The Association does not use any derivative financial instruments to alter the effect of this risk.

10. Contributed materials

During the year, the Association received donated golf products estimated at a value of \$18,100 (2024 - \$18,100).



